NUISANCE CORRESPONDENCE - MOD(AIR) BLACKLIST PROCEDURE

Ref A: D/S10(Air)/45/9/6 dated 8 June 84

1. It is five years since the MOD(Air) nuisance correspondence procedure was outlined at Ref A. As an aid to new staff and to update branch titles, this revised version has been produced.
2. Correspondence with people outside the Department can reach a stage where they persist in writing about a particular subject even though the fullest possible answer has been given on several occasions. Where this occurs, it is usual for the person to be declared and listed as a nuisance correspondent so that any further correspondence from them, on the subject in question, is intentionally not answered, so long as no new points relevant to the case are raised.
3. When a correspondent has reached the nuisance stage, a summary of the case with a recommendation for blacklisting should be prepared and referred to the Head of Division concerned, with all the correspondence, for a decision on blacklisting. This action should, however, be regarded only as a last resort and should be taken, in the case of Ministerial correspondence, only after agreement with the relevant Private Office. If blacklisting is agreed, it will normally be on the understanding that a final letter is then sent to the correspondent informing him or her that

no useful purpose will be served by continuing the correspondence. The outside of the relevant file(s) should be annotated as follows:

"The person to whom this file relates is regarded as a nuisance correspondent on the subject(s) of Any further communication from him/her on this/these subject(s) should be ignored. Signed Branch Date"

4. So that other offices which may receive a letter or communication on the subject in question from a nuisance correspondent may be aware that it should not be answered, the branch responsible for the subject concerned should, immediately a person is blacklisted, notify in writing the following offices as well as those which are, or could be, directly concerned with the subject.

APS/Minister(AF)
APS/US of S(AF)
Defence Services Secretary (petitions to The Sovereign only)
CPR
Head of PL(SPP)
Head of PL(LS)
P Man 3d(RAF)
PM(AR)1(RAF)
Ministry of Defence Enquiries (MB)

The notification should contain the following information:

name, rank/no (if applicable), address, subject, branch, file number and date placed on list.

5. Should a correspondent who has been blacklisted by the Department subsequently petition The Queen, or take up their case with Ministers, through their MP, for the first time, then that correspondence should be answered. A person who repeatedly petitions The Sovereign on the same subject may be blacklisted but a Minister cannot refuse to answer a Parliamentary Enquiry. An MP can, however, be requested to agree to the termination of correspondence. Assuming such agreement is reached, any new MP involved thereafter should receive background information and be asked to agree to the correspondence remaining closed.

Thank you for your letter to my predecessor, Section 40 on the subject of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFO's).

I think it would be helpful if I begin by explaining that the Ministry of Defence was content that the Rendlesham incident was of no defence significance because whatever was witnessed was not apparently hostile. As you know, our interest in the UFO phenomenon is limited to the question of defence. We are satisfied that no threat to the UK's defences has yet occurred.

With regard to your request for information, as you are already aware, because of the provisions of the Public Records Act we are unable to release details of reports 'en bloc'. Therefore it will not be possible to release a 'small sample' of reports. As we have stated previously, we may be able to help with specific enquiries about particular incidents, but to answer an enquiry as general as yours is not permissible under current legislation.

Finally, I regret that we do not have figures for the numbers of reports received in the years prior to 1980. The files in question are now in MOD archives, and we have neither the staff nor the resources to facilitate the research this question entails. However, I can tell you that during 1989 we received 258 reports.

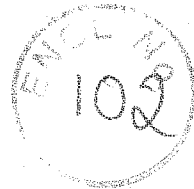

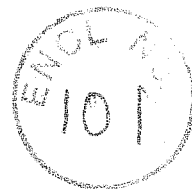

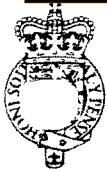

I refer to your letter of 20 November addressed to Sec(AS)2. As this office is responsible for the Department's records under the provisions of the Public Records Acts we have been asked to reply on their behalf.

Under section 5(1) of the Public Record Act of 1958 public records are not made available for public inspection for 50 years from their creation. This period was subsequently reduced to 30 years under section 1 of the Public Records Act of 1967 and this 30 year period before public access is granted to official records is what is commonly referred to as "the 30 year rule". This restriction applies to all official records, irrespective of whether they are classified or not.

Our enquiries have indicated that there are no Ministry of Defence records relating to UFOs in the Public Record Office at Kew. A House of Lords debate on the topic on 4 March 1982 revealed that all UFO records prior to 1967 has not been preserved. Those created after that date are subject to the 30 year retention rule.

It seems, therefore, that there are no official papers on this subject presently available in the PRO and in their absence I can only refer you to commercially available books and publications which may indicate other primary source material.

I am sorry we cannot be of more assistance to you in this matter.

Thank you for your letter of 4th November 1989 and the accompanying photocopy of the Halt report.

To correct your mistake - the Rendlesham Forest incident occurred in 1980 not December 1988.

Also, with reference to the book 'Skycrash' by Jenny Randles, MOD files exist from 1962 onwards, yet you state from 1968.

To correct my mistake the original betwaters/bentwaters triple radar contact was in 1956 (not 1965).

However, I would like to know now the number of reported sightings received by the MOD from the years 1962 (or 1968) until 1980 - and the present number of sightings during 1989 until the present date.

The Rendlesham Forest case is of prime concern, though - you may be unaware of the existence of the 'Halt' tape but this may be due

to the MOD, without investigation, during the sighting as of no defence implication - the tape was released to the public (specifically the UFO case investigators) by Colonel Sam Morgan the Wobridge base commander, directly from Charles Hall and confirmed as real by a number of witnesses to the actual event.

However reading the photocopy I cannot understand the lack of interest on the MOD's behalf. I have seen this copy a number of times and its report of a CES (ie a solid metal UFO) accompanied by physical evidence - depressions in the ground and radiation traces is amazing and worthy of considerable follow up reports & investigation. Yet the MOD did none despite the seriousness to which the Nato base staff attributed the close encounter. The fact that animals at the sight also reacted to the sighting prove that it was real and not some misidentification of a normal occurrence - that the MOD and yourself state that it had no defence implications is worthy of a more detail explanation for this reasoning.

When in the past you have stated that no UFO sighting has been backed up by physical evidence and yet you still hold files on cases like this it is plain that you are not giving me the facts.

If you still believe that UFO sightings have no defence implications, yet you lack the funds to investigate any of them, couldn't you at least release those files and reports you hold that have been made by the public and government services (those cases involving sincere reasons for security notwithstanding) to public investigators and interested parties, such as myself, who are able to investigate them thoroughly with no government expense involved?

With your continual references to the lack of funds and cost of upkeeping UFO records I am sure that it could be easier to pass them on to people more suitably experienced in dealing with UFO cases and recognising the valid cases worthy of storage from the numerous misidentifications of planes, balloons and meteorites that occur.

Finally in a catch 22 situation you state you can give me information on cases within 3 years ago, yet (unless I am very good at guessing) you will not release a report unless I specifically request it, while providing no details of the reports you do hold - is it possible that without this vignardole you could release to me at least a small sample of the files you do hold within the 3 year limit? I will respect your decision not to release anything implying defense implications et al but I am sure many reports are by members of the public seeking proper investigation and a positive answer, not silence and a place in a file - if you aren't going to do anything about them why keep the thousand-odd reports in secret?

Whatever your opinion, thanks for your time ~

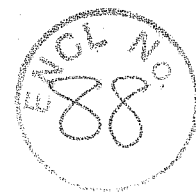

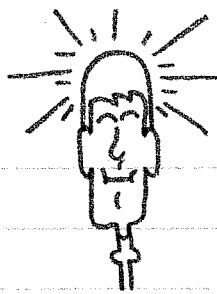

UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECTS

In writing on this topic one must first establish one's credibility. I am an architect, retired from PSA at Grade 6 on reaching 60 in 1985, but remain in the Civil Service employed by MoD as an AO in the Map Research and Library Group, Mapping and Charting Establishment RE, at Tolworth. I was a Captain in the Royal Engineers in WW2 and afterwards in the TA.

My family and I have experienced a number of UFO sightings over the years but have never been able to discover the reporting centre until a recent event prompted enquires among colleagues and led to yourself as the focal point.

The two sightings I first wish to report have features in common, were both made from this address and seen by both my wife and myself:-

1. On Saturday, 6 September 1980, at about 04.25 hrs

My wife was awake and, on looking out of the window, (the full width of the room and facing due east), noticed a red bright darting light, flashing at regular intervals, making enormous leaps across the sky at high altitude at very high speed. She immediately woke me and we watched the object together for some time before it became fainter as it moved towards the horizon. It made dramatic changes of course at what appeared to be each flash and appeared to cover the whole field of visible sky in its erratic movements.

2. On Tuesday, 31 October 1989, at approx 18.30 hrs

Having just returned from work, I was in the garden looking for our cat when I saw a similar bright red light, flashing at regular intervals, moving fast at high altitude from the east directly overhead. The object was not however on a straight course although its general direction was westwards over the house. I called my wife from the kitchen and we observed the phenomenon together, remembering what we had seen in 1980. This object made sudden minor changes of direction, of not more than perhaps 20 degrees, but more remarkably, its speed was seen to vary at random, sometimes slowing down and then accelerating. We had to move into the middle of our lawn to watch it move over the roof when, just before it got to the horizon, there appeared to be a bright white flash to its south, after which it vanished.

Neither of these objects moved with the characteristics to be expected of aircraft, satellites or ballistic missiles, although, being relatively near Heathrow, I am aware that aircraft display various forms of flashing navigation lights after dark. The great height and speed of the objects suggested another order of space technology?

One other sighting I would mention, although not documented at the time, was seen by various members of the family, by friends and the local police. We then lived at **Section 40** when in August 1979 at about 01.00 hrs, my daughter and a friend noticed a large bright light, stationary most of the time but occasionally moving slowly, fairly low in the sky to the west. It appeared to have red and green glows rotating about an axis and its relative position and movement were easily fixed against trees. In due course the whole family and friends were alerted and as the object moved in this way for over an hour, we called the police and had the satisfaction of hearing a police sergeant say to control over his car radio "I see what they see" before it disappeared.

We logged the sighting with a UFO society someone recommended and were visited next day by a bunch of nutters who showed us pictures of spaceships and aliens and whom we got rid of as quickly as possible.

It is generally said that MoD knows more than it is prepared to reveal and this becomes more acceptable in view of the advent of Star Wars weapon systems. We only ask to be told as much as we need to know!

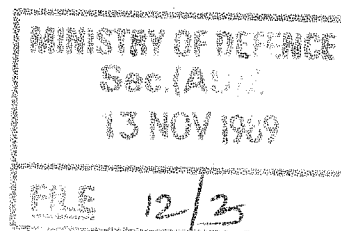

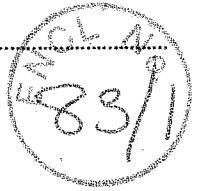

Thank you for your letter of 30 October, in which you raised a number of points relating to the subject of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs).

I think it would be helpful to reiterate that the vast majority of the sighting reports the Ministry of Defence receives come from members of the public, and that since 1968 we have kept a running tally of the reports received because of the interest the general public has in the subject. Similarly, I would like to repeat that unless we consider UFOs are a threat to the security of the United Kingdom, and this has not been the case so far, no attempt is made by the MOD to investigate or identify whatever might have been seen.

You also asked for details of the unusual incident witnessed at Rendlesham Forest in December 1988. The only information that we have on this event is a copy of the report submitted by Lt Col Charles Halt USAF. I enclose a copy of this report for your information. Again, the Ministry of Defence did not consider it necessary to investigate the incident, as it was felt that no threat to the UK's defences and security had occurred. We are not aware of the existence of an audio tape recording of the incident.

Finally, with regard to your follow-up letter which we received on 6 November, we do not have any information on the sighting at Lakenheath in August 1965, since all our records prior to 1968 were destroyed in accordance with the appropriate procedures at the time. I should also point out that we are only able to answer specific queries about events which have occurred recently, ie, within the last three years, as we have neither the staff nor the resources to facilitate searches through our archives.

I hope that you will find this helpful.

1. In line with **Section 40** minute at Reference, I seek to draw your attention to correspondence which the Department has had over the past 15 months with **Section 40**. The relevant material on "Irregularities in Radio Communication" is attached. You will see that her primary concern lies with the illegal use of transmitters which she maintains have been placed about her person. She believes that the MoD is aware of these "experiments" or, if this is not the case, that we should want to know about them. She believes that the experiments have defence implications. She has taken up the issue with, amongst others, CDS and SofS.

2. Every effort has been made to answer **Section 40** questions and we have regularly stated that the matter she raises is of no interest to the MoD. The most recent letter, dated 20 Oct 89, considers the matter formally closed and suggests that further correspondence would serve no purpose. Given this was to no avail, I suggest that it is now appropriate to blacklist **Section 40**.

3. Although the issue has yet to be discussed with SofS' or CDS' outer offices, I do not foresee that they will object to the blacklisting of **Section 40**, indeed ADC/CDS has established through his own channels that our respondent is **Section 40**.

Thank you for your report to RAF St Athan of an unusual sighting which you witnessed on 25 August, a copy of which has been passed to the Ministry of Defence.

You may find it helpful if I begin by explaining that while the Ministry of Defence does receive and co-ordinate some reports of UFO sightings, our sole concern is to determine whether or not they present a threat to the security of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that they do - and this has not been the case so far - we do not attempt to investigate further or to identify whatever might have been seen.

Given our limited involvement with this subject, the MOD does not have any department which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying UFO reports, nor do we have any staff employed on the subject full time. I am sure that you will appreciate that defence funds are already fully committed to the continuing security of the United Kingdom against, primarily, aggression from the Warsaw Pact countries. This being so, we could not justify the use of defence funds on scientific investigations, unless a clear threat to the security of the UK had been identified.

In this context, I regret that I am unable to offer a definitive explanation for what you witnessed, although it is possible that the light you saw was reflected, rather than being emitted by the object.

Thank you again for taking the time to make a report. I hope you will find this reply helpful.

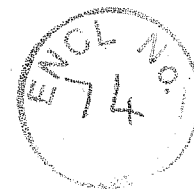

Thank you for your letter of 23rd October on the subject of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFO's), and in particular the unusual incident witnessed at Rendlesham Forest in 1980.

As you will know from our previous correspondence the only information the Ministry of Defence has on the Rendlesham Forest incident is a copy of the report submitted by Lt Col Halt. I am not aware of the existence of a tape recording. I think it also would be helpful to reiterate that we are content that the incident did not have any defence implications, and as such, was not investigated by the UK MOD.

On a more general note, you may be interested to know that the Public Records Act is an Act which covers all Government files (be they classified or unclassified) and which does not allow general public viewing until thirty years after the last action has been taken. Therefore, although our files on UFO reports are unclassified, I regret we are not able to release 'en bloc' any material that we might have.

Because of our limited resources, I regret that it has not been possible to instigate searches through our archives for reports of events far in the past. In this context, you will understand that I have been unable to ascertain whether we received a sighting report relating to the re-entry into the atmosphere of the satellite Cosmos 749 in December 1980.

As far as contacting RAF personnel is concerned, I think it is fair to say that there is nothing to prevent your writing to anyone. However, I think it must be borne in mind that the individuals now serving at the USAF bases at Mildenhall and Woodbridge would be hard pressed to answer queries, given that it is unlikely that they would have been serving there in 1980. I hope you will appreciate that after nine years, people will have little recall of what was, in defence terms, an incident of very little significance.

As to the remainder of your queries, I would suggest that they are more a matter for the USAF.

I hope that you will find this helpful.

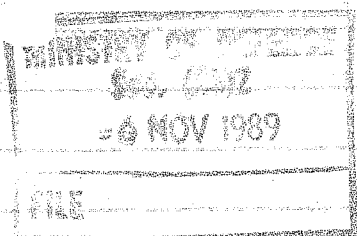

concerning the dispensation given to answer specific queries about particular incidents and to give details of any reports (if any) concerning the case, I wish to learn more about a particular incident.

In January 1969, in the USA, the Condon Committee issued a final report on the problem of UFOs. Of the 91 cases looked at, 61 were identified as misperceptions, hoaxes et al.

Of the remaining unknowns, one case concerned a sighting at Lakenheath, England in August 1965. Gordon Thayer, in discussing unidentified visual and radar phenomenon within the report, states as an example the Lakenheath case which involved a UFO tracked by two different ground radar stations, an aircraft radar and visually by independent witnesses. The sighting was concluded to be that of an object intelligently controlled.

Thayer states "This is the most puzzling and

unusual case in the radar-visual files. The apparently rational, intelligent behaviour of the UFO suggests a mechanical device of unknown origin as the most probable explanation of this sighting.".... He continued, "the probability that at least one genuine UFO was involved appeared to be fairly high."

At the time of this Committee report, the attitude to UFO's was highly critical yet this sighting remained unexplained.

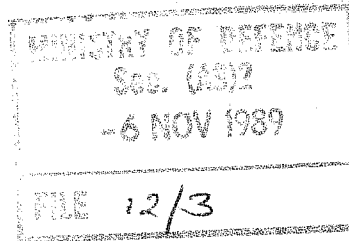

It stayed for a while then accelerated straight ahead, disappearing from view. We discussed this and some 2 - 3 miles on the same thing happened as in incident number 1.

Each time the object seemed to be 2 - 3 miles away at an altitude of 1 000 - 2 000'.

There was only one bright light - no others of any colour and it did not appear to pulsate.

Thank you for your prompt reply to my letter (dated 25th October 1989). In receiving your answers to some of my questions, I am interested enough to press the matter further.

With regards to the number of filed reports on UFO experiences that you have recorded, you state that in total the figure for 1980 to 1988 adds up to 2650 (in some years over one every day). From this figure you ascertain from past experience "that only a very small proportion... originate from defence related sources."

Considering that the MOD sees no defence implications with UFO's and that is no physical evidence for the existence of UFO'S (photographic or otherwise), I find it difficult to believe:

a) that you even bother to hold 2650 reports on a non-existent phenomenon (let alone the thousands since 1962) and

b) that any reports have originated from defence related sources - if such sources help in the defence of this country then they should either be carefully questioned

as to why they reported dosening that the MOD terms
the non-existent phenomenon as, having no defence
implications and therefore of no concern to them or
to thoroughly investigate what the reporting sources most
dearly believe to be a defence 'threat' worthy of reporting
to the MOD.

Hopefully these points will be answered.

I am less sure of position in answering the next point,
but it is worth putting to you anyway.

On 30th December 1980, a UFO sighting
lasting from the 27th December 1980 caused a search
party to be sent out to 'recover' a presumably crashed
object within Rendlesham Forest by the staff of USAF
Bentwaters. A taped recording of the subsequent search
was made by the party leader Deputy Base Commander
Lt Col. Charles Halt. This recording was confirmed as
authentic by the Base Commander Colonel Sam Morgan,
Lt. Col. Charles Halt and analysts in Washington DC
upon its release to public investigators, even though the
edited 18 minute long tape contains the verbal recording
of a further UFO encounter.

That the sighting was real is unquestionable
through the use of the FOIA in America. However this
material also underlined the fact that the MOD also had
reports on the sightings - one specifically by Lt. Col.
Charles Halt dated 13th January 1981, reported to the RAF.
The facts as stated leave only the question of what
actually happened to be confirmed by the MOD.

You do keep reports on UFOs and you haven't been
given dispensation to release information on the contents

of the reports in answer to specific questions -
I merely wish to exercise this right by asking what
is the reported evidence of what happened during the
USAF Bentwaters sighting of the 27th to 30th December 1980
of a UFO within the area of Rendlesham Forest, as
witnessed by local peoples and Policemen, and what was the
subsequent MOD and RAF involvement in the case.

I am aware of the 30 year
rule of the Public Records Act, but considering that
all UFO reports prior to 1962 have been destroyed by
the MOD as a matter of policy, it will be a few
more years yet until any information can be gleaned.

With upto 600 reports a year though, the wait will
be worth it.

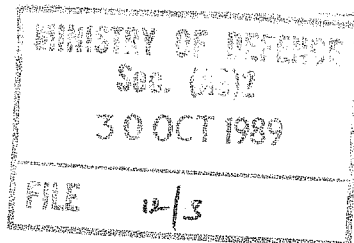

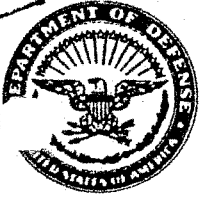
I am enclosing herewith a copy of the correspondence with NSA/CSS as you requested.

The documents are classified because their disclosure could reasonably be expected to cause exceptionally grave damage to the national security. Because the documents are currently and properly classified, they are exempt from disclosure pursuant to the first exemption of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. section 552(b)(1)).

In addition, this Agency is authorized by various statutes to protect certain information concerning its activities. We have determined that such information exists in these documents. Accordingly, those portions are also exempt from disclosure pursuant to the third exemption of the FOIA which provides for the withholding of information specifically protected from disclosure by statute. The specific statutes applicable in this case are Title 18 U.S. Code 798; Title 50 U.S. Code 403(d)(3); and Section 6, Public Law 86-36 (50 U.S. Code 402 note).

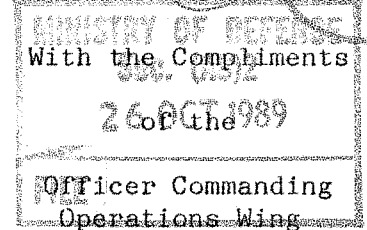

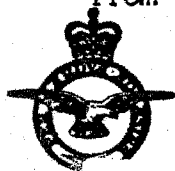

I am writing in response to your telephone call of 4 October concerning an Unidentified Flying Object you reported that night.

I have investigated the matter and at the moment I am unable to advise you of its identity. Our records show that we had no aircraft on frequency at the time, nor were the local or approach controllers aware of any traffic in our immediate area. However, your report suggests a helicopter and there may well have been a civil machine operating outside our control zone at that time; the contact may also have been very many miles distant (as your report suggests, and a common occurrence at night).

As I have been unable to identify positively the cause of your sighting, I have passed on your report to the appropriate department in the Ministry of Defence who will look into it further. Meanwhile please call us again immediately if there is a recurrence, so that we can - hopefully - clear up the matter there and then.

Dear Sir:

I have some areas of subject questions which require some informative answers from your MOD staff.

1. On the subject of this 13-Jan-1981 memo of Colonel Charles I. Halt. From your 20-January-1989, letter of reply. Your dept staff indicated that because of the two week delay in reporting the incident, together with the low key manner in which he handled the matter, were indicative of the degree of importance in defence terms which should be attached to the incident. Because of this your dept did not feel that the incidents were a threat to the security of the UK and the sighting was not investigated further.
2. Did the MOD send a letter acknowledging Col Halt's interest in informing the MOD in the interest of protocol, as to the exact situation, even though it was two weeks late in informing your dept.
Would your dept staff have greatly appreciated being given this memo just two days after the alleged events, along with a copy of this audio tape made on site by Col Charles I. Halt, to assist your dept in it's Defence Implecation investigation. Has the MOD reemphasized the important need for obtaining these sighting memo's as soon as possible, through the British RAF CO's at these USAF base's. By communicating through proper channels of communication at your dept.
3. Through diligent research inquiry I have obtained the original in copy format, USAF letter dated 14-June-1983 letter. I will enclose a copy for your reference here. It concerns this Halt memo being released by the USAF at the 513TH Combat Support, by their then CO, Col Peter W. Bent, USAF. What is unusual is that they had to ask the British Ministry of Defence, Royal Air Force and Her Majesty's government for a copy of the document, to fullfill a American Freedom Of Information Act request by a UFO enthusiast in my country representing the group Citizens Against UFO Secrecy, CAUS. Was the MOD made aware of the fact, when the USAF asked for a copy of this memo. It is obvious that from this UFO group, the authors of Sky Crash did obtain the copy of the Halt memo.
4. Here, now I see how your public Records Act works, if a British citizen were to ask for this Halt memo from your dept. Because of provisions of this regulation, these documents are prohibited from public disclosure to british citizens. However if the USAF originated document is properly requested by the USAF for a UFO enthusiast in the US. Then it can be released by the MOD. Can it also then be released to any British UFO enthusiast. My self being a US citizen, would I be exempt from being able to obtain recent USAF originated memo's through your dept. Or is your regulati- applicable to all general civillian inquiries, with no exception to being a British or US citizen.

5. Here, there is a question about British UFO enthusiast looking into some specific rumour regarding USAF personnel witnessing what they might perceive as unknown light/UFO phenomena, while they are on duty at their assigned post duty area. It is understood that there is a British RAF CO duty stationed at most USAF base's. I am aware of USAF Regulation 190-1, (The Public Affairs Regulation), which states that all contacts and request for interviews of active duty personnel regarding incidents that occur relating to their military duties, must go through the USAF local Public Affairs Office. Are British citizens required to go through the British RAF CO, if they ask for permission to interview USAF personnel. Or are they prohibited from bothering the USAF personnel and the British RAF CO, concerning his low flying noisy air craft complaint file.
6. With regard to the British RAF CO's assigned to specific USAF base's, it is of interest here to determine this individual's over all function with regard to these USAF base's. Do they have any joint authority with the USAF base CO, concerning over all command decisions. Or is his main job as a communication link between the MOD, RAF, USAF, and local civilians who wish communication with his office on daily matters of concern. Do you have any communication memo's from a previous British RAF CO at the 81ST TFW, Squadron Leader Donald E. Moreland, concerning the rather bothersome activities of the authors of Sky Crash.
7. It concerns 23-Feb-1984, 11:30pm, RAF Bentwaters time. **Section 40** and **Section 40** seem to have gotten into some trouble with Colonel Charles I. Halt, regarding this Unauthorized Entry Regulation. They seem to have been involved in some unauthorized activity, involving **Section 40** while Col Charles I. Halt was off base and in the US. While I am respectful of an individual's right to guaranteed privacy. I would like to know if the MOD ever was debriefed about the three UFO enthusiast getting into your Official Secrets Act or other violation of British Civil regulations, by bothering Halt's family.
8. Here, on the subject of the low flying noisy air craft complaint file maintained by the British RAF CO at the USAF base's. What are the restrictions governing exactly what he may say to visiting members of the news media or British UFO enthusiast, when they inquire concerning this file, and the USAF and their filed memo's in his file. If he has just forwarded a sighting report, is he restricted by regulations, as to what may be said. If the British RAF CO has just processed a memo from a USAF individual, concerning activity involving on duty sighting of unknown light phenomena by USAF personnel. Can he mention the rumour that there may have been some unusual sighting of possible unknown light phenomena. Or is the British RAF CO expected to be rather discreet about such incidents involving USAF personnel. Is it okay for a British RAF CO to mention the fact that there was a memo processed through his office, forwarded to the MOD. After the investigation has determined the events to be of no Defence Implication. Or does this have to come from your dept only after individual written inquiries from interested individuals.

9. Here, on the subject of the soviet satellite Cosmos 749, which reentered the Earth's upper atmosphere on 25-Dec-1980, 21.10hrs. This was observed in Paco De Arcos, Portugal. Later the satellite was seen breaking up into six circular pieces, heading towards Folkestone, Kent, ENGLAND, in the direction of East Anglia and Thames Estuary. Was the satellite completely vapourized, so no debris survived reentry and impacted with a ground area. Requiring a clean up of a given location. In 1978, a Cosmos 957 satellite with a nuclear power plant, did survive some form of reentry. There were areas of radioactive debris in remote locations in Canada. There was extensive effort to clean up the debris containing hazardous radioactive material. Did the MOD have a extensive detailed plan for clean up if there were any radioactive debris.
10. Here, on the subject of this audio tape of Colonel Charles I. Halt's. Exactly what is the official view of your dept, does it represent a off duty activity of some USAF personnel. This is a difficult question, because the USAF is not suppose to authorize military equipment for any other than for official use only. I am a bit concerned about their obtaining some sort of radioactive readings, on this excursion into the Rendlesham Forest. The USAF officially say's that such readings would by their standards, just normal background counts. Does the MOD agree to the USAF position on this. I would like to determine a source for the alleged radioactive readings. One candidate might have a source in this Soviet Cosmos 749. Possibly some minor residual material, with trace's of radioactive material, might be a candidate for the cause of these readings.
11. Here I am asking for permission to communicate with the British RAF CO at 3D Air Force at RAF Mildenhall. There are some minor questions which if in any way possible, his department would be much better qualified to answer my letter of inquiry. The USAF has a regulation AFR 190, (the Public Affairs regulation), states that any such release of information must be made through the local Air Force Public Affairs Officer. However, due to the fact that the British RAF CO is not under USAF regulations or policy. It is very difficult to send a inquiry to this individual, and expect him to answer in a return reply. Is there some thing that I am missing with regard to these British RAF CO's, concerning whether this individual is authorized possibly to not answer any american UFO enthusiast inquiry. I have sent a few inquiries to the British RAF CO at the 81ST TFW, however no reply had ever been sent by his dept. Do you know if these British RAF CO's at these USAF Base's are obligated via RAF policy, to answer only British citizen inquiry, concerning UFO phenomena. His job in part is to inform any British citizen visiting his office, who wish to inquire about sightings by USAF personnel of UFO phenomena. Exactly what MOD policy is and USAF interest in cooperation, where there is a need for discession. It concerns USAF policy of no longer having any official investigative interest in this UFO phenomena. And your Official Secrets Act. and Public Records Act. There must by now, seem to be a understanding about your regulations and the USAF interest in maintaining their policy.
12. How are the MOD policy regulations handled at the British RAF CO's office, in regard to these USAF sighting memo's. Has the USAF asked for advise of concern or been requested by the MOD to not allow their USAF personnel to conduct any unauthorized interviews. If such interviews are granted by USAF personnel.

13. Has the MOD ever heard of any problems about USAF personnel violating this AFR 190 by granting unauthorized interviews with the authors of Sky Crash. I have heard that some USAF personnel in unauthorized interviews, stated their base CO then Col Gordon E. Williams, USAF, was involved as a witness of some very unusual off base activity, where a UFO supposedly landed in the Rendlesham Forrest. I am very much concerned about such unauthorized debriefings. Did the MOD ever receive any debriefings on such unusual unauthorized activity. I have in doing some research, uncovered some names of USAF personnel involved in such obvious and unauthorized activity. Does the name's of Larry Warren and Steve LaPlume appear in any debriefing from the USAF at 3D Air Force Office of Special Investigations.
14. Here, if possible, can your dept release copie's of letters of return reply for a few British news paper tabuloid organizations. I wish to examin weither there are any differing answers in your dept head's Section 40 and their return replie's to any British media inquiry regarding the Halt memo. I wish to determin exactly when the memo was officially acknowledged as existing in your dept file and when the Halt memo was officially released to a member of the British media or to any British UFO enthusiast, around 14-June-1983.
15. On the subject of paragraph # 7, did the USAF revoke Section 40 bus pass, which gave him permission to be on base at the 81ST TFW, to pursue some business activities. The British authors of Sky Crash in their own version, state that they were detained on the night in question, at the 81ST Security Police, main communications building. They were questioned by civilian police, concerning their unauthorized entry into Halt's base residence. It is understood that no formal charge's were filed by Col Charles I. Halt. They were advised on the rule for unauthorized by the British civilian police, who advised them never to bother Halt again. Does the MOD have a proper debriefing on the matter, which can be released, if possible. I wish to learn of the circumstances which brought about Halt's warranted action against the three UFO enthusiast.
16. Here on paragraph # 12, Are British civilians officially discouraged from request for interviews of any USAF personnel, who have seen what they percieve as UFO phenomena. If they can push a little through asking through a British RAF CO to obtain permission from the USAF individual. Would the interview have to be monitored by USAF OSI, also are there certain restrictions as to what a individual may say in a interview with the British UFO enthusiast.

In closing, it is appreciated by my self that your dept is able to answer some of the questions in my letter of inquiry. However some of the requested information being requested, will not be in your dept files. I seriously and sincerely hope that not too much difficulty is encountered by your staff personnel, in their course of answering possibly this letter of inquiry. Thank you very much.

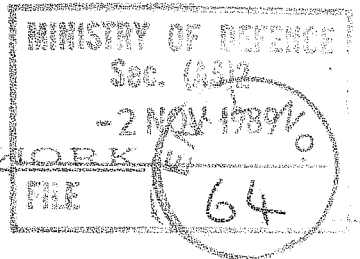

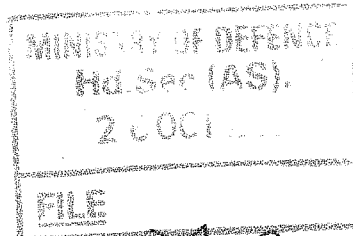

Thank you for your letter to the Secretary of State for Defence on the subject of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs). I have been asked to reply.

I think it would be helpful if I begin by explaining that whilst we do receive and co-ordinate some information about UFO sightings, the sole concern of the Ministry of Defence is to determine whether or not UFOs present a threat to the security and defence of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that they do, and this has not been the case so far, no attempt is made by MOD to investigate or identify the objects.

The Ministry of Defence has no department which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying reports of UFOs and we have no staff who are employed on the subject full time. The sighting reports we receive, which are usually limited to the brief details of the incident passed on to us by those who witnessed them, are referred to our staff in the departments which are responsible for the air defence of the United Kingdom, and they examine the reports as part of their normal duties.

Since our interest in UFOs is limited to possible defence implications we do not carry out studies into the UFO phenomenon nor do we have the resources to undertake any in depth investigations or general surveys. I hope that you will appreciate that defence funds are already fully committed to the continuing security of the UK against, primarily, aggression from the Warsaw Pact countries. This being so we could not justify the use of defence funds on scientific investigations, unless a clear threat to the security of the UK had been identified.

More specifically, you asked for information on the number of sighting reports we receive. Although I regret that because of our limited resources it has not been possible to establish the exact origin of the reports I can confirm that we have received the following number since 1980.

1980 - 350	1984 - 215
1981 - 600	1985 - 175
1982 - 250	1986 - 120
1983 - 390	1987 - 150
	1988 - 400

Nevertheless, from past experience, I would say that only a very small proportion of our reports originate from defence related sources.

You also enquired if any reports have been backed up by physical evidence. As far as we are aware, no reported sighting has been accompanied by a definitive photograph or similar and we have no record of any radar traces caused by alleged UFO activity. I should point out, however, that the UKs Air Defence radar (UKADGE) acts as part of the overall defensive umbrella protecting our country and, as such, is targetted to scan the approaches to the UK rather than our homeland.

With regard to the further release of information on this subject, I regret that all MOD files, like those of other government departments, are subject to the Public Records Act. As you may know, this Act states that official files (be they classified or unclassified) remain closed from public viewing for 30 years after the last action has been taken. There is no UK equivalent to the American Freedom of Information Act. Nevertheless, we have been given dispensation to answer specific queries about particular incidents which have occurred recently, and if we have a report on it, to let you know what it contains.

I hope that you will find this helpful.

Thank you for your letter of 25 September to the Ministry of Defence about the subject of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs). I have been asked to reply.

You asked about our involvement with this particular subject. I think it would be helpful if I explain that whilst we do receive and co-ordinate some information about UFO sightings, the sole concern of the MOD is to determine whether or not they present a threat to the security and defence of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that they do, and this has not been the case so far, we do not attempt to investigate or identify whatever might have been seen.

Although the MOD has no department or agency which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying UFO reports, and no staff employed on the subject full time, all correspondence which you wish to send to the MOD on UFO matters should be addressed to this office. I must stress at this point, however, that we do not carry out investigations or surveys on behalf of the public, and that the information we have on the subject is usually limited to brief reports of unusual sightings passed on to us by those who witnessed them. Nevertheless, should you wish to enquire about a particular incident that has occurred recently then we can let you know whether we have received a report on it, and if so what it contains. Should you wish to contact somebody in your locality, I would suggest that you contact the Air Traffic control at Southampton Airport. They *may* be able to help you further.

As far as the UFO subject in general is concerned, we would agree that many strange things have been observed in the sky. The reports that we receive show this clearly. Nonetheless, we believe that rational explanations could probably be found for most of them. Possibilities that spring to mind include satellite debris, clouds, aircraft and meteorological balloons.

I hope that you will find this helpful.

Thank you for your letter of 26 September on the subject of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs).

I think it would be helpful if I first of all remind you that although we do receive and co-ordinate some information about UFO sightings, the sole concern of the Ministry of Defence is to determine whether or not UFOs present a threat to the security and defence of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that they do, and this has not been the case so far, no attempt is made by the MOD to investigate or identify whatever might have been seen.

The MOD has no department which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying reports of UFOs and we have no staff who are employed on the subject full time. Indeed, although I am the principal co-ordinator of UFO information within the department, this particular aspect of my duties takes up a very small percentage of my time. I hope you will understand that the Air Staff Secretariat's role in providing briefing and secretariat assistance to MOD Ministers on matters affecting the RAF is rather more important to our day to day duties.

As far as the receipt of sighting reports is concerned, I would say that nearly all of the reports we receive originate from civilian members of the public. Sightings by military personnel have also been received on occasion, but these are few and far between.

The reports that we receive are, as I mentioned in my letter to Section 40 subject to the Public Records Act, which states that official files remain closed from public viewing for 30 years after the last action has been taken. Please note that this Act covers all Governmental files, irrespective of whether they are classified or unclassified. Nevertheless, we do have a dispensation to answer any specific queries an individual may have about particular incidents which have occurred recently should, of course, we have any information on the sighting ourselves. This practice has been followed for some years now. I hope that this makes the position clear. I would also like to reaffirm that all of the information that we have on UFOs is unclassified.

Lastly, you provided a copy of a newspaper cutting which alleged that a senior MOD official interviewed some individuals about a sighting of a UFO. I have no knowledge of such an event and would like to counter by confirming that it is not the MOD's policy to interview people in connection with UFO sightings.

I hope you will find this reply helpful.

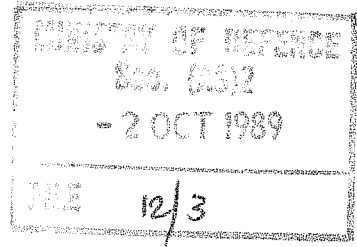

I would like to thank you for our recent telephone conversation in which very candidly you replied to my questions about UFOs.

Whilst bearing in mind the important point which you made that the subject of UFOs is UNCLASSIFIED, and I have that on tape for my records, I have few more questions to ask, which I hope as a matter of courtesy I would have your answers in such manner which would not insult my intelligence.

In order to start my main questions about UFOs, I have one important question to ask you.

1-Are you answerable to anyone above yourself about UFOs, or as our American friends put it, the buck stops with you? If you are answerable to a person/persons above you, could you please let me know who this/these are?

2-During your conversation you mentioned that you receive only civilian reports of UFOs, and never there has been any military report/s passed on to you, and you went on by saying that you would be surprised if any report/s of any kind might surpass your desk.

a) Are you suggesting that only the civilian population of United Kingdom takes notice and the military and the Air Force has no interest or intention? Your words also could be in a curious way be interpreted as, that this phenomena is only endemic to civilians and it never happens to military, which I am sure you would agree with me, it is just not true.

However, if we take the point you raised that you have never sighted any military report/s, then it leaves the ordinary person in the street with some serious doubts that how the security forces of this country could be counted on whilst the airspace is invaded from time to time by unknown object/s, and as yet the official responsible department does not consider this as serious as it ought to be. My understanding is that our other NATO allies have somewhat different viewpoint than yours on this matter. Could you please explain the official stand point on this.

b) Or, it just may be that they do take serious notice of UFOs, but reports from those sources are not available to the public, which in itself is a contradiction to your comments.

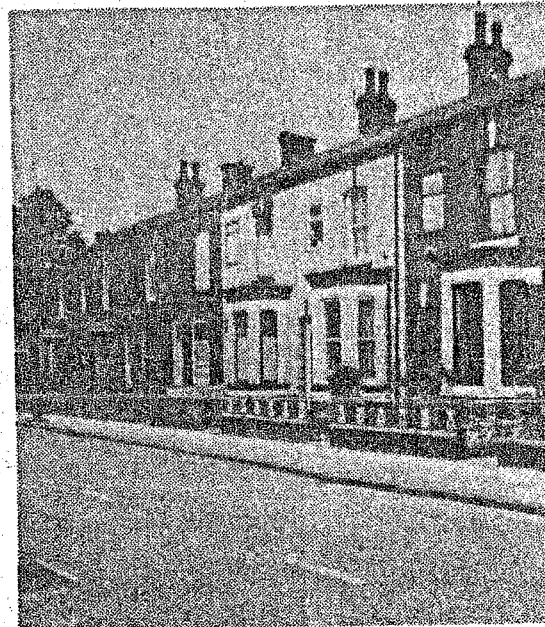

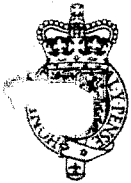

Unless we judge that they do, and this has not been the case so far, we do not attempt to investigate further or identify whatever might have been seen.

Given this limited involvement with the subject, the MOD does not have any department which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying UFO reports, nor do we have any staff employed on the subject full time. As you will expect, therefore, we do not carry out studies, investigations or surveys into the phenomena nor do we have the resources to do so. I hope you will appreciate that defence funds are already fully committed to the continuing security of the UK against, primarily, the threat of aggression from the Warsaw Pact countries. This being the case, we could not justify the use of defence funds on scientific investigations, unless a clear threat to the security of the UK has been identified.

Nevertheless, we do, of course, recognise that there are many strange things to be seen in the sky, by we believe that rational explanations can be found for most of them. Indeed, we have yet to receive conclusive evidence that alien spacecraft have landed on the planet.

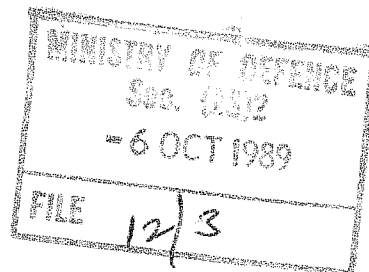

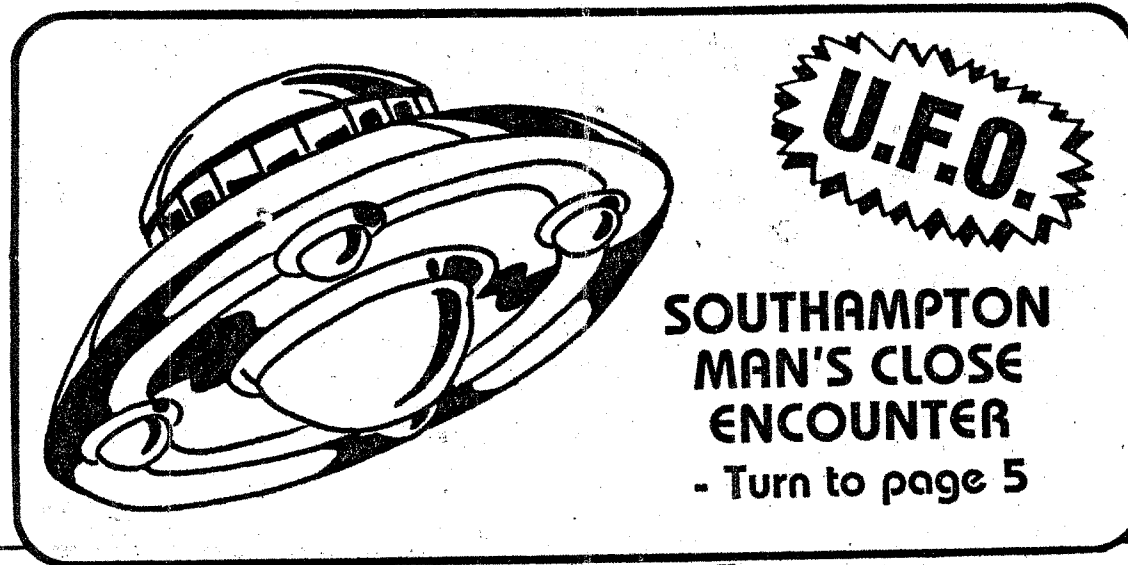

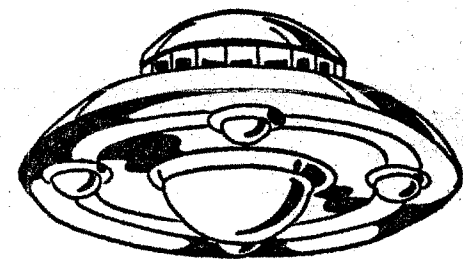

were both an egg shape with one lopped off and the back was a gold colour.

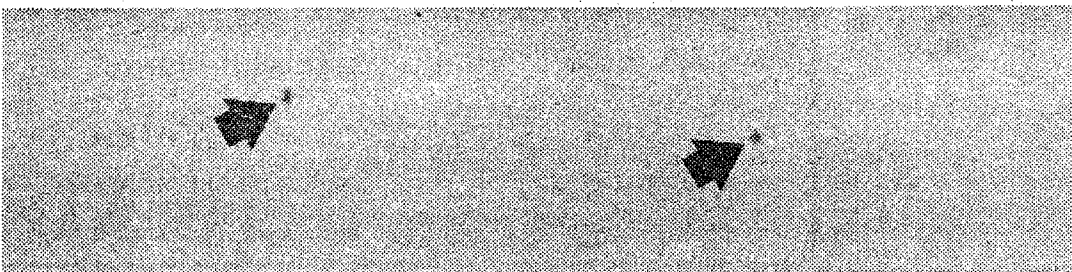
"There appeared to be something hanging down from each one of them and they must have each been bigger than a 747 jet."

"Irregularities in Radio Communication."

Introduction.

I, Section 40 am subjected to mysterious happenings which can only occur with the use of an electromagnetic device. Scientists using high technological equipment have deliberately introduced me to a form of radio communication by which I am able to receive messages. Permission has not been asked of me and, whether I like it or not, training has been given for me to understand the capabilities of the device. 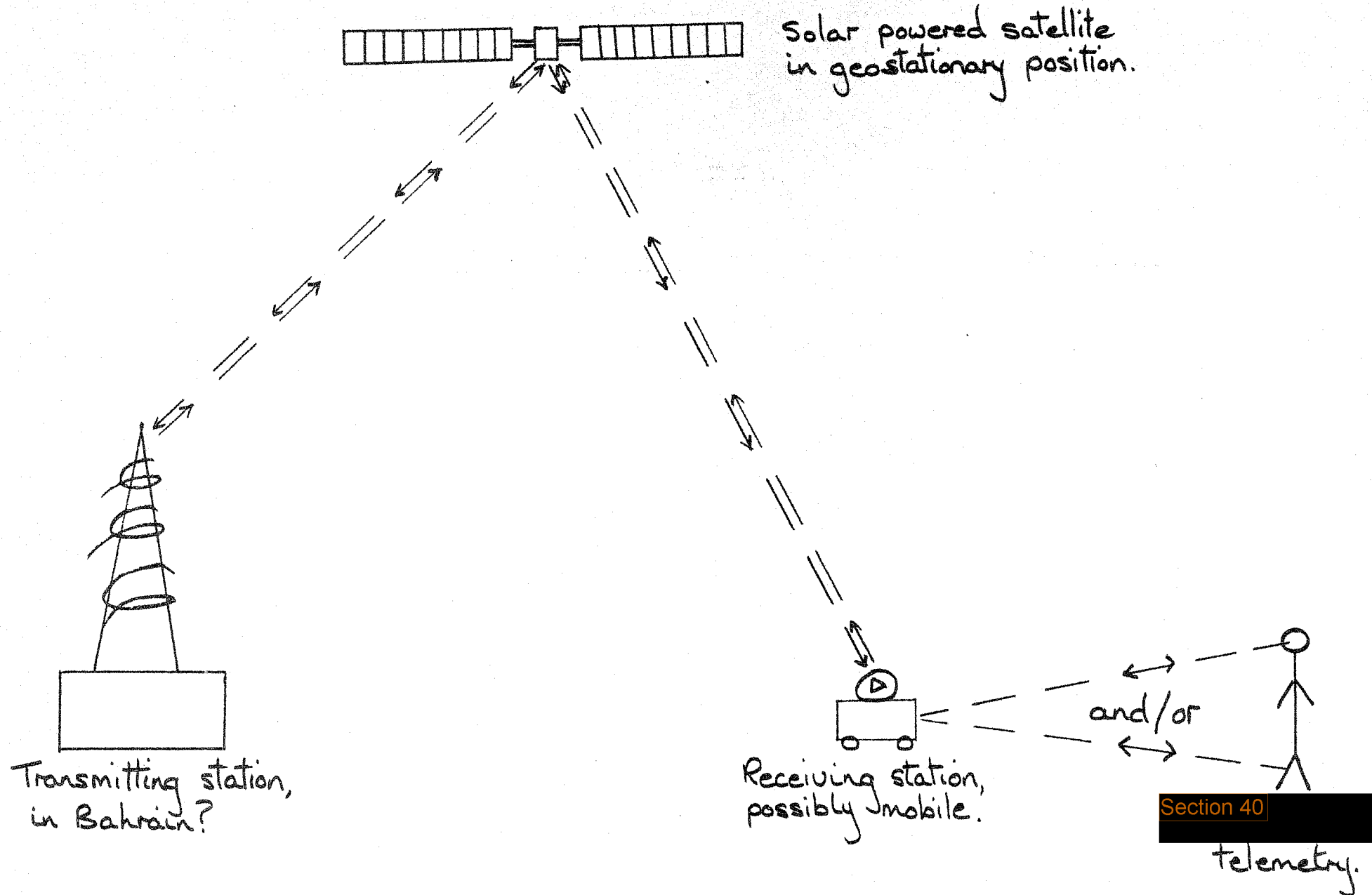
b. Monitors.

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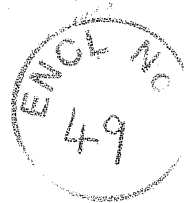

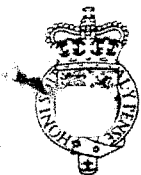
It may be useful if I begin by explaining that while the Ministry of Defence does receive and co-ordinate some reports of UFO sightings, our sole concern is to establish whether or not they present a threat to the security of the United Kingdom. If we do not feel that this is so, and this has been the case so far, we do not attempt to investigate further, or identify whatever might have been seen.

In this context, I am unable to offer a definitive explanation for what was witnessed, and due to a lack of resources I regret that we have been unable to establish whether or not RAF aircraft were in the area at the time in question. However, I can confirm that Sutton Coldfield is in the Birmingham Avoidance Area, and, as such, low flying aircraft - that is, aircraft flying at below 2000 feet - would not have been witnessed.

Thank you for your letter of 6 September to the Ministry of Defence on the subject of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs).

As you may be aware from our previous correspondence with ICUFON, the UK Ministry of Defence has only a very limited involvement with this particular subject. With regard to the unusual incident witnessed at Rendlesham Forest in December 1980, to which you refer, I can advise you that we were provided with a copy of the short report submitted by Lt Col Charles Halt USAF. However, since our interest in this subject is solely limited to the question of defence, and since it was felt that the events were not of any significance to our continuing defence and security, the MOD did not investigate, nor did we feel there was any need to investigate, the matter further. Moreover, despite the assumptions made in your account the UK MOD has yet to receive conclusive evidence that alien spacecraft or beings have landed on the planet.

Lastly, I would like to confirm that although the UK MOD does liaise closely with the United States on many matters affecting the defence of Western civilisation, through NATO for instance, we do not liaise on the subject of UFOs or alien beings.

I hope that you will find this helpful.

As this is the first time I have ever written to a Member of Parliament and as the subject I wish to enquire about is highly controversial I do hope you will take this letter seriously, in the manner that it was written.

Seemingly only over a hundred people have written to their MP on the subject of UFO's, resulting in evasive or conflicting opinions on the matter.

I wish to enquire ~~to~~ from you, as an MP who is able to gain these facts, as to the Governmental procedures (specifically the Department of Defence) in dealing with the reports of Unidentified Aerial Phenomenon as reported through the Police, airport authorities, armed forces and similar.

At present, reading through the available literature, it seems that many inexplicable reported cases of UAP activity by the general public, police and government forces are deemed to be of no interest to a government programme of investigation due to there being 'no defence implications.'

However, they are recognised as a tenable phenomenon whose activity is worthy of serious governmental investigation in the USA, France, China and many other countries where this has been made public, and they are a cause for concern to the airports, military installations and airbases et al where many reports have originated.

That there has been in the recent past a parliamentary UFO group studying reports of such a nature I wonder if it is possible for you to provide me with some information, in the spirit that I am sure this group would have wished.

To begin with, some information for yourself :-

21 October 1978, 6-19pm - **Section 40**, a flying instructor, reported seeing a UFO while flying from Moorabin, Victoria to King island, Tasmania. The taped conversation between him and the Melbourne flight service unit controller, **Section 40** describes a large unidentified metallic craft which approached his Cessna 182 and tracked him until 7-12:49pm when all contact was lost. An hour later a full search and rescue attempt failed to find any wreckage whatsoever. Despite censorship, separate UFO reports back-up the report, but the official cause of **Section 40** (assumed) death remains undetermined.

Revealed in 1982 by a former First Lieutenant of the US Airforce, **Section 40** is the existence of recorded film made by the military in 1965 of an Atlas F testflight. **Section 40** present at the actual launch, stated that footage of the event shown to him by his superior Major **Section 40** clearly showed a solid UFO encounter the missile at an altitude of 60 miles, alter course to meet the missile and emit bursts of light. The UFO then vanished and the missile malfunctioned, hundreds of miles short of its target falling into the Pacific Ocean. CIA agents, believed to have been present at showing took the film into their possession.

On the night of the 27 and 29 december 1980 an unknown structured craft landed in Rendlesham forest, Suffolk and caused USAF Woodbridge to be stationed on alert. A tape recording exists of the subsequent search and attempted recovery of the craft, made by the Deputy Base Commander Lieutenant Colonel Charles Halt, which was made available to the public in 1984 by the Base Commander Sam Morgan. Both men were present during the all night search and were witness to visual phenomenon and physical evidence as to the validity of the sighting as a real UFO.

The cases cited are all factual, based entirely on official information from military and governmental sources and freely discussed in print.

1. How many real UAP has been reported to the Ministry of Defence during the years 1980 - 1988; of these how many were reported by the defence services?
2. How many UAP reports have been backed up by physical evidence, inclusive of radar traces.?
3. In considering the information on the previous page, is the present government aware of any attempts to implicate UFO activity as a cover for covert military activity ^{by} allied or non-alliance forces?
4. With the present attitude of the Department of defence being that UFO's pose no defence implications, will the Government allow further public access to the files it does have on UFO reports, subject to similar restrictions as imposed under the Freedom of Information Act as applied to the public in the US and many other western countries?

I hope that you could arrange for some type of reply to the questions I have asked and that your personal views may be drawn from such factual cases as I have stated, based only on official sources of information.

I am writing in connection with a number of reports of anomalous airborne light phenomena which have been reported to myself over the last two to three years.

Whilst I fully understand that your interest in UFOs is limited to possible defence implications I do understand that you may assist members of the public if they have legitimate enquiries and I am therefore writing in the hope that you can help me identify and close the few cases which remain outstanding in my files.

Before we proceed perhaps I should explain a little about myself. I understand that you have had many cranks writing to you in the past 'demanding' information which they claim you possess concerning crashed saucers, aliens and the like. I can say in all honesty that I detest these people as much as you must. My interest in the paranormal stems from an interest in the sciences and, as a result of this, I investigate and research with a scientific leaning. I do not believe that the earth is being visited by aliens and I also deny that UFOs are their means of conveyance. I draw no conclusions other than these, preferring to work along the lines of investigation oriented rather than belief oriented research. I also believe that various systems of misperception and hallucination may well be responsible for a great proportion, if not all, of UFO sightings.

However, the sightings to which I refer defy identification. All of the witnesses speak of between two to six points of light which oscillate vertically and horizontally, appear and disappear, change colour, merge into one, align themselves vertically and horizontally and also illuminate the hills around them. These lights are all viewed from roughly the same area, this being ref 037315 of OS landranger sheet 104 1:50,000, and

appear in an area of sky to the south west of this location at between thirty and fifty degrees in elevation though some witnesses have reported that they may 'hover' at ground level and also reach a point at or near to the zenith. All of the sightings take place at night, usually between 20:00 -02:00 hrs GMT. The sightings can be of between fifteen minutes to three hours in duration.

I suspected an astronomical explanation at first. However, considering that these lights have defied sidereal motion throughout their history appears to dispute this. I have also considered many other mundane explanations but none appear to stand up when one considers the sheer regularity of this phenomenon.

I should be most grateful if you could help me in solving these cases and, preferably, finding a mundane explanation for these sightings in order that I can satisfy many sceptical witnesses.

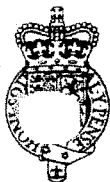

Thank you for your letter and the enclosed information on the Unidentified Flying Object (UFO) sighting witnessed in Staffordshire. I was interested to read your comments and your report, but believe I should take the opportunity to counter some of your comments. In our correspondence with William Cash, MP, to which you refer, I think it would be fairer to say that we merely suggested that the sighting could have been caused by extra air traffic around Birmingham, rather than that we concluded positively that this was the case. A small but nevertheless valid point. Indeed, from the description of the sighting we would agree that it could also have been caused by a tanker exercise, but I regret that due to a lack of time and resources I have been unable to establish this definitely.

I was also disappointed to read that our response to Mr Cash was treated as "yet another" example of MOD secrecy. As I have mentioned before, we do not attempt to cover up the phenomena, and I would suggest that our sometimes rudimentary replies are a product of the lack of significance the subject holds within MOD compared to other more pressing matters. I know that this runs counter to your views, but it is a fact nonetheless.

Thank you again for your letter. I hope that you will find this reply helpful.

If we do not feel that this is so, and this has been the case so far, we do not attempt to investigate further, or identify whatever might have been seen. As you will expect, therefore, we do not carry out studies, investigations or surveys into the phenomena, nor do we have the resources to do so.

In this context, I am unable to offer you a definitive explanation as to what was witnessed. However, from the description it is possible that it could have been a civil aircraft seen from an unusual angle. Certainly the lighting patterns are consistent with a modern aircraft, and we have found that it is notoriously difficult to see the exact shape of aircraft at night.

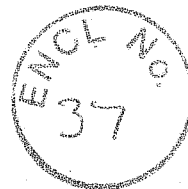

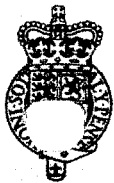

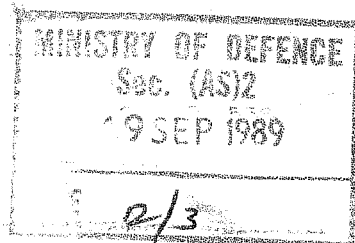

Recently we received a multiple-witness report of several unidentified objects which were seen in the sky over Blackpool, and which have so far proved difficult to explain. We are wondering, therefore, if you are aware of any aircraft in the area at the time which fits the witnesses' description.

I will quote part of a letter from one of the witnesses, a signalbox man who was on duty at Blackpool North railway station when the objects were seen on Saturday afternoon, June 10th, this year.

'The passage overhead of three aircraft of a type with which I was not familiar - slow moving single-wing craft - attracted my attention. This was at 15.22 - my job requires regular consultation of the clock so the time was noted. I became aware of a very bright silvery object ...(travelling west to east)...which I at first thought was a balloon of the type sold to visitors in these parts. But when it disappeared behind high cloud I realised it was far too high for an object such as a small balloon to be seen with the naked eye. Further observation revealed not one but three objects of equal brightness equidistant from one another...(in a line). I alerted two workmates, one of whom had binoculars. He told me they looked like bright silver balls. They disappeared into cloud in the east...

'I wasn't able to give constant observation, but at 15.38 I noted another bright

object appear out of the bank of cloud in the west, and quickly became aware that it was accompanied by four others, all in a small circle of equal distance and brightness. It was difficult at times to see all of them all of the time due to broken cloud...'

Sightings of these objects continued throughout the afternoon. All were travelling west to east and were on more or less the same flight path. In all sixteen objects were observed.

This case is proving a surprisingly difficult one to solve. At first we thought that these objects were probably toy helium-filled balloons. But no event, public or otherwise, involving toy balloons took place that day. Furthermore, the height of the objects, the formation and stability, the result of a little balloon experiment we carried out, as well as several other factors suggest that these objects were not toy balloons. And from information supplied to us by the Met. Office, we know that they could not have been weather balloons.

There is another factor which suggests that the explanation, whatever it turns out to be, is not a mundane one. The witness whose letter I have quoted has been working in this particular signalbox for more than ten years, and during this time has learnt to recognize all kinds of aerial phenomena, including toy balloons and sunlight reflected off gulls - which he says can be very deceptive; yet he has never seen anything resembling this.

We are now looking at the possibility that the eye was deceived and the objects were not precisely round-shaped, that they were perhaps some type of aircraft. We do know, however, that west to east is not a normal flight path of airliners.

Any information you can give us would be greatly appreciated.

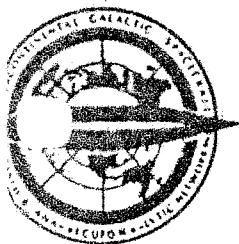

THE FIRST LANDING ON THE BASE AREA (Lt.Col Hart Report's 1st paragraph)

December 27, 1980, in the early morning hours (Approx. 03:00 local time) the USAF Routine Patrol of the Woodbridge AFB observed some bright light passed over the base and disappeared in the nearby Rendlesham Forest. Seemingly a peculiar light source through the trees in the nearby forest, the patrol received permission to check it.

When through the gate (see sketch) they reached the wood, having had stopped their jeep part way and proceeded foot. They observed a strange structured craft on the ground.- Then they hurried back to the base and reported their experience.

Base Commander Major General Gordon WILLIAMS silently alerted the important officers of his staff, the OSI - Office of Special Investigation, Security and Security Police as his entourage the observation of the landing site.

On the location they witnessed a disc-shaped object with slight dome on its top, with a sticking apex. It was landed on a tripod legs. The craft's bottom projected down to the ground a shaft of light in which three hovering entities were seen, making efforts to rectify some accidental malfunction.

General Williams advanced his entourage, ordered all the officers back, and alone neared the craft to scrutinize right where the aliens were in shaft. According to the officers they appeared to communicated with some sign language or telepathy. Entities were 3'2" in high wearing all-over silver suits.

When the repairing was completed, the craft took off. It did shakingly at the start, but soon shot away at a tremendous speed. The alien object (galactic spacecraft) was earthbound on the location over three hours. The participant high ranking military officers and the security force informed, that before and during the incident no order was given for any military or armed action to take the alien craft into custody or capture the crew.

The Air Force Information crew and several officers photographed the craft and the aliens activity. But, General Williams still on the location confiscated all the cameras, films and strongly called to attention the national security law, and ordered to every one, to remain silent about what they had witnessed.

INVESTIGATION OF THE LANDING SITE (Lt.Col.Hart's Report 2nd paragraph.)

Lt.Col. Hart's Report second paragraph without any doubt suggests that on the next day (December 28) he headed the investigation on the location. (Consult his report's paragraph # 2.)

C.

THE SECOND LANDING ON THE BASE AREA (Lt.Col. Hart's Report 3rd paragraph.)

Lt.Col. Hart's brief summary as eye-witness carefully disregards the details of his observation. But its completely identify Larry Warren's statement.

Larry Warren, 20, was a security policeman at the USAF Woodbridge base. On December 29/30 he was on duty at the flight line, when shortly after midnight a jeep driven by Sergeant Adrian BUSTINA with a lieutenant pulled up beside him. The jeep stopped at the Motor Pool and picked up a gas powered spotlight unit mounted on a trailer, then a captain occupied a seat. Then they started to the direction of the Rendlesham forest. On the road he observed vehicles in a small convoy filled with officers. The military radio network's conversation mentioned several officers by name and many times was repeated the "OSI" - Office of Special Investigation. As unusual, the forest animals, rabbits, deers were running berserk out of the forest.

It seemed that the whole NATO base was preorganized for a repeated landing

attempt reasoned on 14 September and the 13 November dogfights with an UFO near to the base area.

At the First Staging Area in the forest having passed a large number of military men and British military personnel.- At the Second Staging Post Warren was ordered to leave his weapon and move ahead with four men including the captain on their jeep.

Arriving at a glade on the edge, he saw a movie (TV?) camera pointing toward a "transparent aspirin like platform", about 50 feet in diameter. It was hovering slightly off the ground, and pulsed with a bright misty yellow glow. This platform was surrounded with a group of motionless security men.

"Here it comes!" heard Warren as he gave attention to the radio communicator. Then saw a bright red light approaching from behind the trees and flying straight forward to the aspirin base. Maintaining a total silence, the red light exploded in a fantastic burst of multiple colors. The flash blinded the crowd totally. When dissolved, the aspirin base and the light effect were missing and instead a LARGE METALLIC OBJECT BECAME MORE AND MORE DISTINCT. (UFO forces are great masters to delude and astray with spectacular effects (camouflage) the military vigilance.

The craft was a domed white glowing disc. Two little flaps, like thin wings, came out of each side. It glowed but were cast on it. Warren and his colleagues were interested in observing closely some unusual shadowy effect, when a small green light appeared on the surface of the craft above one of the shadows. (A similar spot as on a TV video game.) Then Warren lost his consciousness.

Late in the day of December 30th, he with his security policemen colleagues were summoned to the Commander's Office. Civilians in the office were CIA personnel. They were checked for radiation, debriefed for an hour and signed forms not to talk to anybody of the events.

A few months later Warren was sent back to USA and by honorable discharge left the Air Force. As a civilian later on he issued pseudonym as "Art Wallace" information on his experience to news papers and the British private UFO investigators, the writers of the "Sky Crash". For these reasons his attempt to return the military service was allegedly denied.

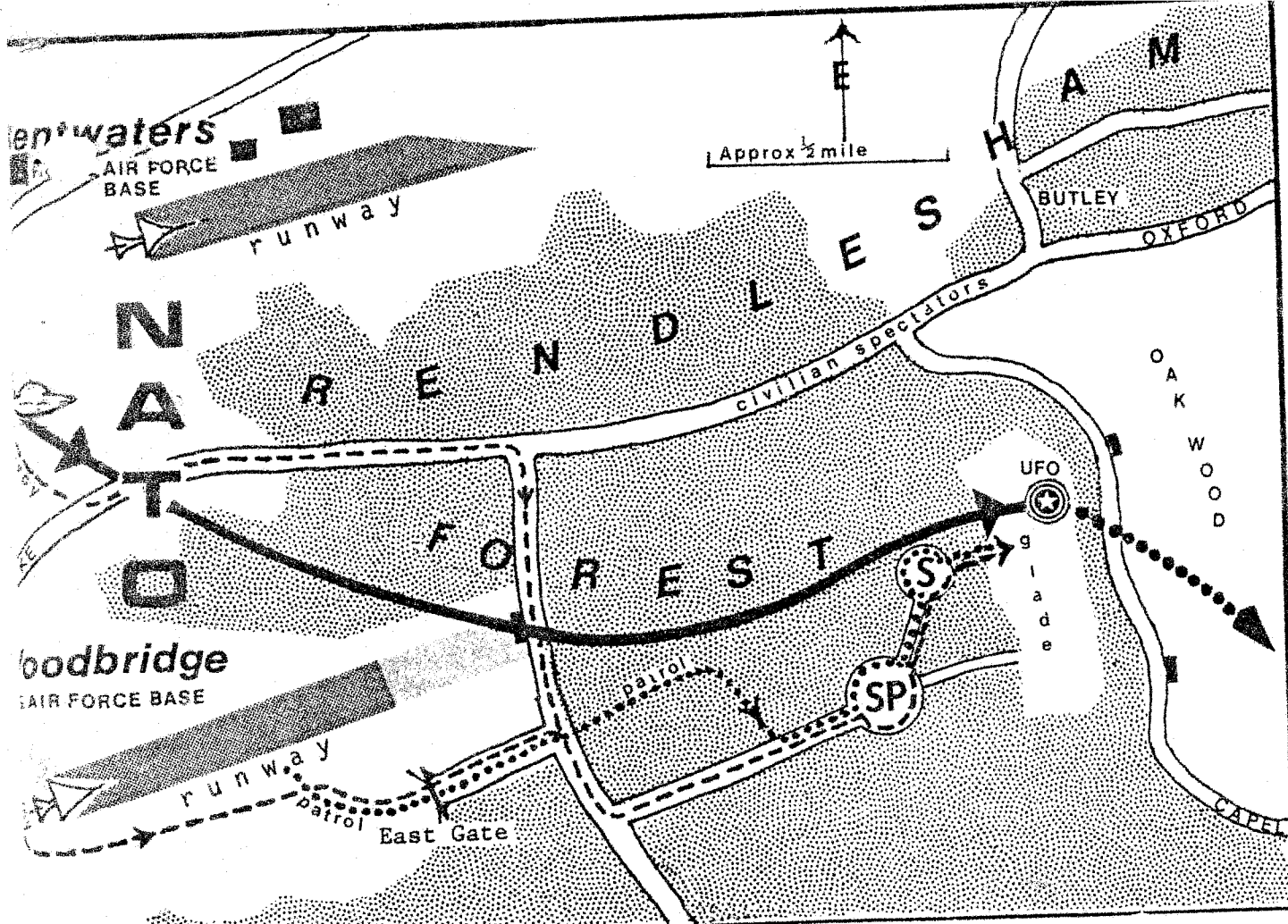

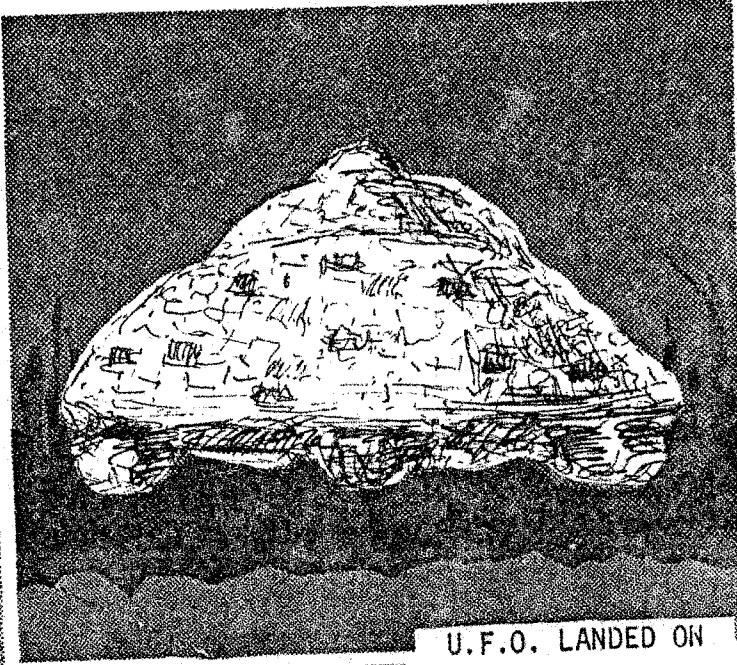

Thank you for your last detailed letter concerning my investigations into a number of Midlands UFO cases, such as the Staffordshire flap of May 1988 and the Godmanchester (Cambs) encounter. All the information that you enclosed was very useful and appreciated, particularly the photostats of a number of MoD UFO report summary forms that you received relating to UFO activity around May 22 1989 in the Midlands area.

I am enclosing a photostat of my case report on this event although I have left out the parts which contain documentary information, etc. I hope that my report proves of some interest to you and that it will assist in closing the flap of May 1988 in Staffordshire as 'closed - IFO (Identified Flying Object)'. As you will find my investigations conclude that the event was the result of mass misperception of a refuelling exercise by VC-10 tankers from 101 Squadron flying from RAF Brize Norton. It is therefore with some disappointment and concern that official conclusions stated that the events were the result of extra air traffic around Birmingham airport. This was particularly disappointing when the Stafford MP, William Cash, also made representations to finding out the cause of the sightings in and around his constituency. You will also note that, apart from one acknowledgement in the beginning of our enquiries, this particular elected representative of the public failed to respond or even to acknowledge further communications when we were trying to assist him in his enquiries.

However, I must convey my appreciation to you and your department in actually listing me as a contact for members of the public who contact your department as a result of sighting a UFO. I have already received one call from a woman in Gloucestershire who put

interesting info on the sighting witnessed in Stafford etc. As you know we were involved with correspondence from his own MP. was put in contact with me via your department after reporting a UFO. This is currently under investigation by more local investigators and basically represents the sighting of several very bright and moving objects at night which emitted a peculiar buzzing sound. This may prove to be a rare meteorological phenomenon, possibly a Meaden-type plasma vortex currently being studied (see BUFORA's Controversy of the Circles, by Randles and Fuller) as well as Dr Terence Meaden's own The Circles Effect and its Mysteries, both published this year). These plasma vortices appear to be responsible for the enigmatic 'mystery circles' that appear every year in corn fields. BUFORA take the scientific and objective approach that they are (so far as current knowledge is aware) nothing to do with UFOs, and are probably the result of rare, but natural, whirlwind events (vortices).

Once again, many thanks for the time that you have given me in the past and for your confidence in my role as a UFO (and paranormal) investigator/researcher, and should you require further information or data please do not hesitate to contact me.

ABSTRACT

A mysterious object or objects with a multitude of lights was observed by residents in and around Stafford on May 16 1988. Much local press coverage brought further witnesses forward and the local MP, William Cash, even raised the issue to the Ministry of Defence.

There has been speculation that the sightings involved a nocturnal exercise of the top-secret experimental Stealth aircraft.

16 MAY 1988

INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The author first received news of the Stafford flap via the Director of Investigations for BUFORA, Section 40, through several newspaper clippings and via articles in NUFON News, in which she is editor.
- 1.2 Due to the pressures of various matters pertaining at the time and the wide scope of the sightings, this event was left until later in the year.
- 1.3 Contact was made with the Staffordshire Newsletter, the local paper that was leading the way with publicising the event and who appealed for further eyewitnesses.
- 1.4 Section 40, the editor, kindly sent me several copies of the various articles and letters referring the event, and through a slow process of detective work, gradually obtained the telephone numbers or addresses of the main eyewitnesses although there must have been many witnesses at the time scattered across the Staffordshire region.
- 1.5 Unfortunately, not one single witness replied to the numerous letters, questionnaires and stamped addressed envelopes that I sent out. This very time consuming and expensive process was repeated in January of this year when all the major witnesses were again contacted but, apart from one witness, not one replied.
- 1.6 Despite this very discouraging appeal it is the investigator's opinion that this event can be concluded as "Known", after investigation.

THE EVENT

- 2.1 The Friday issue of the Staffordshire Newsletter (May 20 1988), page 3, had an article entitled "Did Mystery lights reveal secret flights of F-19?". (see newsclipping). The article stated that two objects were seen flying across Stafford. These were triangular in shape and were reported by Section 40 at 10 pm on Monday, 16 May. She saw them with friends and immediately reported the
- 2.2 Section 40 was at the home of friends - Section 40 and another couple, Section 40 at Fernwood, Stafford, when they saw the object fly towards them.

- 2.3 "We were standing in the garden when two spotlights came through the sky towards us so that we couldn't see anything else", **Section 40** said. "They banked over and went into side by side formation, one above the other, and flew slowly across the sky without any noise at all. They flew very close together and were triangular in shape, too high for microlight aircraft and too low for normal aircraft. There were a lot of lights underneath, red and green, around the edge and within that lots of others.". She further commented that, "I was in the RAF myself for four years and if these were planes, they must have developed something pretty fantastic that defies all the laws of flying".
- 2.4 In the issue dated May 27 the Staffordshire Newsletter published another article entitled "Strange lights riddle still hovers over town". Further responses from readers brought in new eyewitnesses and comments regarding the event of May 16. John Teasdale's account will be dealt with later as I believe that it helps solve the mystery, but it was his opinion, based upon an actual sighting on the same night, that the objects were in fact VC-10s flying from RAF Brize Norton in Oxfordshire.
- 2.5 Another witness was **Section 40** of Uttrexeter who said, "I don't believe they were VC-10s, no way". She further elaborated her statement by saying, "I would know a VC-10 if I saw it. I often used to go to air displays, they definitely weren't that. Mrs Turner said that the objects appeared over her garden hedge, very low, silent and slow moving with a lot of very bright lights. They were too low, slow and quiet and the lights were too bright for VC-10s. It might have been a glider but I would have heard the wind and I heard nothing. VC-10s are pretty big and heavy". **Section 40** also commented that several other people in Uttrexeter had also seen it but had been too afraid of coming forward. Others reported strange clusters of orange and red lights around the same time on Monday at Penkridge, flitting about the sky, disappearing and then reappearing. Again, similar lights were seen at Wolverhampton.
- 2.6 **Section 40** of Penkridge wrote in to say that he too had seen the lights with his wife. "Just after 9.50 pm my wife and I both saw two orangey-red clusters of lights wideley spaced apart apparently hovering south-west of Penkridge. After several minutes in view, the object vanished in the south-west to reappear silently in the sky to the north-east, only a matter of seconds later. It was certainly no conventional craft or balloon, unlike **Section 40** and her friends, we judged it to be a single object not two, but we were unable to determine any shape to it."

He also stated in his letter that he, "...reported our sighting to the local PC at 10.10 pm and he confirmed that just having seen 'something strange'. The following day RAF Cosford denied any knowledge of the subject - none of their aircraft was in the air. But later that day a newspaper admitted receiving a detailed sighting from a Wolverhampton resident."

- 2.7 The following week the Staffordshire Newsletter pursued the local flap with another factual article entitled "I Stood Under It for 15 Minutes" - a reference to the experiences of Stafford residents [Section 40] [Section 40] stated that both her husband and herself saw the object appear and disappear in exactly the same position several times. "We were just on the way back from a stroll on the Monday night and we saw two triangular shapes hovering above some trees. They were lit up, but somehow they didn't seem solid objects. I stood there looking and all of a sudden it just disappeared. I stood there for a while and then it appeared again exactly as before in the same place, hovering for a few seconds before it disappeared again and we walked on".
- 2.8 [Section 40] also reported that their sighting occurred on the same date and time as the previous reports, 9.50 pm on Monday, May 16. She continued, "What struck me more than anything was that it was absolutely silent."
- 2.9 Another witness mentioned in the article concerned a [Section 40], of Harrowby, Street, Littleworth, who said she had a look at the object through binoculars with two neighbours. "It came across the sky, looking just like the sketch in the paper, then it seemed to turn over quickly and as it came over, it was just an array of bright lights, orange, red and blue. We had a look through binoculars but we couldn't see any markings or anything to identify it. The amazing thing about it was that it was so quiet, there was no sound at all. It was going very slowly and seemed in no rush to go anywhere. It felt as though someone was looking down on us and taking pictures".
- 2.10 Another witness was a [Section 40] Church Eaton who said that he had seen exactly the same object seven years ago. "There were reports about it at the time. I saw it just outside Brexton on my way to Stafford. I looked up and saw it and stopped and it was right over head, about 50 feet from end to end, completely motionless and completely silent. There were a lot of lights around it. I got out of the car and stood for about 15 minutes, hoping it was going to land but it just drifted off". He further reiterated his opinion that, "It definitely wasn't a plane, there was no sound at all".
- 2.11 In the Stone Newsletter dated 7 July 1988 it was reported that another Stafford resident had also seen a similar object in the spring of 1981. [Section 40]

of Weeping Cross, Stafford stated that the object as sketched for the Newsletter was identical to the one she saw seven years ago, probably tying in with Section 40 sighting. She saw an object at Brocton and she said that, "I stopped the car and got out and saw this thing which had flashing blue and red lights in the sky. It wasn't moving so I sketched it and then it just disappeared. It didn't fade or move away - one second it was there, the next it was gone".

COVERAGE IN NUFON NEWS

- 3.1 The case is classified as 8807 and was first mentioned in NUFON News No.131 (May/June 1988), and reported the sighting of Section 40 on 16 May. It was here that Section 40 opted for the possibility that the Stealth F-19 (or F-117A as its official nomenclature is) was responsible. The Staffordshire Newsletter carried a good rendition of this theory where it was claimed that BUFORA was considering that particular possibility, and certainly it did seem to fit all the known facts - the apparent triangular configuration, the bright white lights, the silent manoeuvre of the object, and the fact that Stealth aircraft were known to be operating inside UK airbases - an open secret.
- 3.2 Certainly it was the case of misperception playing a considerable influence in the witnesses' observations and how they interpreted the object and its intentions. Section 40 gave a good critique in the Newsletter of how eyewitnesses can be mistaken when viewing objects in nocturnal conditions, particularly when observing apparent hovering, illumination and the lack of sound.
- 3.3 The local Stafford MP, William Cash, entered the scene and on behalf of his constituents began making representations to the Defence Secretary. The MP, using the Newsletter as his medium, began requesting reports from eyewitnesses so that he could present the Ministry with a dossier. On 1 July he advised his constituents that he was to file a detailed report with the Under-Secretary for Defence, Roger Freeman.

ENQUIRIES

- 4.1 Due to the pressure of various commitments I was unable to pursue these cases until a many weeks later, although I did write to the Staffordshire Newsletter for further information and I am indebted to Section 40 in being so co-operative. I also took the opportunity in putting forward BUFORA's position on the UFO phenomena in general and upon the Stafford flap in specifics. I then attempted to track down the many witnesses and in the majority was successful.

I obtained several addresses through Directory Enquiries, the Post Office and through local contacts. I wrote to all known witnesses with an introductory letter, a questionnaire and a stamped addressed envelope and did not receive one reply. A similar exercise, again with stamped addressed envelopes, a couple of months later brought in only one reply.

- 4.2 I wrote to William Cash, MP, enclosing all data on BUFORA's information on triangular -shaped UFOs from the UK since 1978 and our reasoned comments on Stealth. I received an acknowledgement from him with the promise that he would inform me of the results of his enquiries. Nothing has been forthcoming despite four letters over the space of something like 8 months.
- 4.3 Despite the lack of response from witnesses and the MP I have managed to ascertain through newspaper clippings and through contacts at the Newsletter that Bill Cash received an answer from the MoD. The Wolverhampton Express published an article and stated that Defence Minister Roger Freeman had said that the Stafford sightings were due to an increase in activity of aircraft waiting to land at Birmingham airport. In the Staffordshire Newsletter on 14 October he said that (a paraphrase in the article) that, "All Mr Freeman could come up with was an almost laughable 'exceptional busy airport'". Mr Cash added, "The question is how could it be civil aircraft? There are some cranks in the world but these were reliable people who actually saw things... the reply did not tell us very much".
- 4.4 It must be one of the few times that a Member of Parliament has actually taken an interest in UFO reports and the fact that he has taken the matter up with the MoD clearly shows his concern. However, since even an MP was unable to get to the bottom of the truth with the MoD does indeed show the cover-up (through ignorance, secret officialdom and plain bureaucracy than anything else) and how seemingly fruitless it can be for amateur civilian UFO groups to pursue UFO reports with the MoD.
- 4.5 In a letter from the Under-Secretariat for AS-2 (MoD), Section 40 reiterates the official line that the May 16 reports may have been connected with civil air traffic into Birmingham airport, which was apparently exceptionally busy at the time. In defence of this statement it is a fact that the times and descriptions are similar to those of jet aircraft following a holding pattern around the airport. Also, it can also be stated that AS-2 did not apparently investigate these sightings - a strange state of affairs considering that many West Midlands residents witnessed the object(s), and the flap produced Parliamentary Questions from the local Stafford MP.
- 4.6 From copies of released Unclassified documents from the MoD, RAF West Drayton

sent to AS-2 various sighting reports:

(1) 16 May 1988 21.30 hrs Ludlow.

Duration of 15 minutes; one object, umbrella shaped, yellow and green.
Quite bright. North-west.

(2) 16 May 1988 21.43 hrs. Bromsgrove.

Duration 2 minutes; two fan-shaped objects with very bright green, red and amber colours. Low droning sound. Travelling from Bromsgrove to Kidderminster.

(3) 16 May 1988 22.39 hrs. Penkridge, Staffs.

Duration of few minutes., two bright lights descended from 1000 ft to ground level, then turned vertically and left at high speed. Travelling from north to south towards Cannock.

(4) 16 May 1988. 21.50 hrs. Cannock.

Duration of 10 minutes. Two objects, triangular in shape, white light at front of each one. The two other corners of the objects were reddish orange in colour. Moved in the direction of Penkridge from position of observer (at Cannock). The two objects moved in formation keeping same distance apart heading north towards Cannock Chase.

CONCLUSIONS

- 5.1 Despite the almost total lack of assistance from the various witnesses concerned, from William Cash, MP and from the Civilian Aviation Authority, progress was made, principally from the various contacts at the Staffordshire Newsletter and from personal enquiries.
- 5.2 Although the Stealth theory is certainly relevant to this episode the fact remains that the sightings were widespread and were recorded by many witnesses throughout parts of the West Midlands. Also, it is extremely unlikely that Stealth would have been undergoing such flights in such an open manner, and many of the observed characteristics do, however, suggest normal aircraft undergoing holding routines.

- 5.3 The vast array of lights suggests recall to the flap that occurred over the Midlands and Humberside in December 1987 which was identified as aircraft refuelling exercises using KC-135s and F 1-11 aircraft. Although many witnesses identified the low height, hovering and lack of sound as strange, it can be stated that nocturnal observations are often fraught with difficulties, and there is no doubt that these objects were at a high altitude, and that witnesses made the mistake of confusing the bright lights and high altitude with a low height and strange shape. If the objects were part of a refuelling exercise then the sight would have been confusing as the lights would have been numerous and bright, totally unlike normal aircraft configurations. Indeed, RAF Brize Norton did confirm that two VC-10s were in the air and it is quite conceivable that they may have been over the West Midlands around 10 pm.
- 5.4 One witness who was not only well qualified to observe nocturnal aircraft but who was also in an ideal position was Section 40. Section 40 sums up his observation as follows: "... as far as I am concerned the sighting on the night of 16 May last year (1988) was of an identified flying object, ie 2 VC-10s of 101 Squadron RAF Brize Norton executing an in-flight refuelling exercise". Section 40 qualifications for this statement are that he has been an avid aircraft enthusiast and has spent many hours watching aircraft in the air. He is also an architect by profession and therefore has the necessary feeling for scale, proportion and the environment in general.
- 5.5 Section 40 was driving home to Stafford from Burton-on-Trent (ie from the NW) with his wife. Section 40 described the night as extremely clear - "one of the clearest I can ever remember". He also states that the atmosphere "sparkled, there was no mist and visibility was unlimited". They had just crossed Blithfield Reservoir heading South on the A5013 and on reaching the top of a hill that overlooked the northern edge of Cannock Chase, they saw two lights moving slowly from left to right almost immediately ahead., estimated at about 25 degrees to the horizontal. They could not be certain of the exact time but do know that it coincided with the other sighting reports. Section 40 states that, "My first thought was that they could be microlight aircraft because (a) the lights were very bright and seemed to be about one or two miles away and (b) they were not close enough together at that distance to be one aircraft, and (c) they were moving too slowly at my estimated distance away to be even light aircraft, of a conventional design".
- 5.6 They continued to Rugeley (South) with the lights still in view and then decided to stop at Bellamoor Service Station about 2 miles south of the Reservoir. Mr Section 40 was outside and used his binoculars for the rest of his observations.

- 5.7 He continued, " The lights continued to proceed slowly to the West and then diminished in brightness and it became clear that they were changing direction and slowly executing a 180 degree turn. This meant the lights were returning and would soon be coming overhead. As they approached, more lights appeared and it was obvious 'something special' was in the air. We were completely baffled until the lights (now quite complex but in two clusters) were immediately overhead. and proceeding steadily to the East. I suddenly realised I was watching 2 VC-10s one immediately behind the other. My reasons for this identification are (a) the lights of the second aircraft illuminated the four tail mounted jets of the first, and (b) the sound of jet engines could just be heard for a brief moment".
- 5.8 **Section 40** further adds that he had never before seen such an unusual display of lights in the night sky, and makes the telling comment that, "It is not difficult to understand why other people had written to the newspaper and I can appreciate the mystery that ensued".
- 5.9 Further follow-up with RAF Brize Norton did reveal that two of their VC-10s were airborne at the time.
- 5.10 **Section 40** also added that "Two points occurred to me later, "(a) I estimated their height (once I knew what I was looking at) at between 15000-25000 feet in which case they were in controlled airspace and air traffic control must have given clearance for their presence, and (b) it is quite impossible to judge height and distance away of a light or lights unless you know what you are looking at".

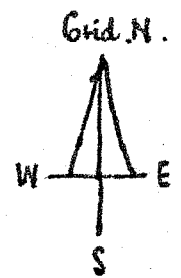
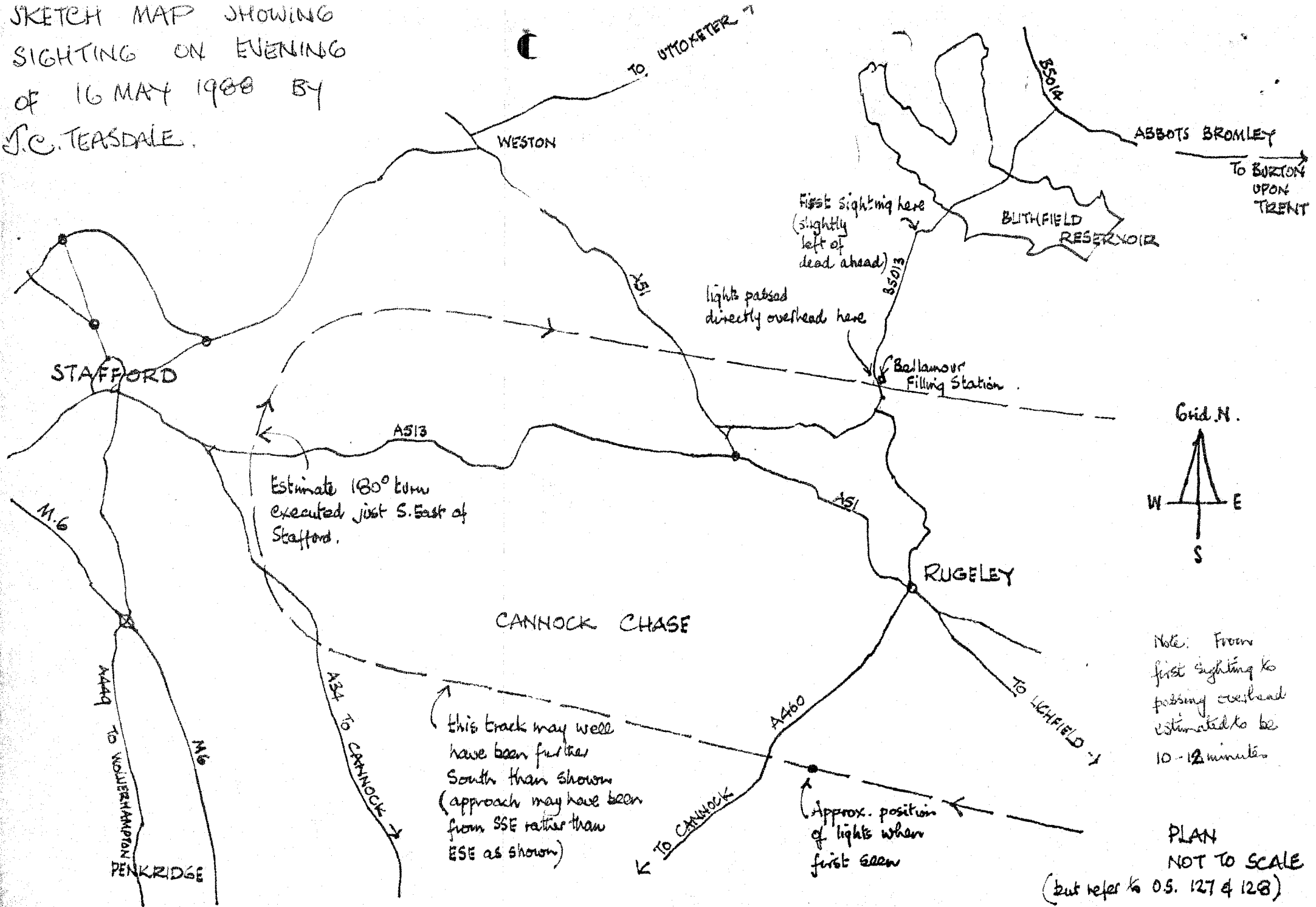
- 6.1 The flap of sightings of an apparently low-flying, brilliantly lit, and silent object that was observed by scores of witnesses in Staffordshire and the West Midlands can be positively identified as a refuelling exercise using two VC-10s from RAF Brize Norton.
- 6.2 One witness who was not only well-qualified to observe nocturnal lights but was underneath the object identified the lights as aircraft, and specifically as two VC-10s.
- 6.3 It would seem that the vast number of witnesses, many of them with little or no experience of observing aircraft at night, misinterpreted the objects which was peculiar in that two aircraft were present, flying very high and slow. Witnesses thus saw a vast array of lights that were seemingly quite low, silent and took on the appearance of hovering. A
- 6.4 As we have noted such illusions are commonly reported and more so when there

were two aircraft involved, flying close and very high with no sound. Even

Section 40 with all his experience of aircraft recognition, was unable to determine the lights and believed at first that the object was not too far away. It was only as the accidental result of his positioning on the ground that he was able to gain an under view of the lights and could identify the object, which turned out to be two aircraft. Even then the drone of aircraft engine noise was limited duration and faint.

- 6.5 The route that the object took can also be compared with **Section 40** observations and the other sightings. The lights observed at Ludlow seem to be of a similar or the same object in terms of shape, lighting and duration. That was observed at around 21.30 hrs, and was then apparently sighted at Bromsgrove, roughly West, at around 21.43 hrs. If **Section 40** observed the lights at around 22.30 hrs, 45 minutes after having last been sighted to the south-west, the object would have had to travel perhaps south of Birmingham, to make the route that the Staffordshire sightings were reported. The object was observed at Penkridge, south of Stafford, at around 22.39 hrs, in Stafford at around 22.50 hrs, and was observed on its return journey, north of Rugby, by **Section 40** at an unknown time.
- 6.6 On **Section 40** sketch the route of the objects is plotted out and concurs with the other Staffordshire reports, ie Stafford, Cannock, and Penkridge. **Section 40** objects, not only in terms of date and approximate time, and location, but of shape and lighting configuration, positively points to the Stafford flap being the result of an RAF refuelling exercise.
- 6.7 **Section 40** does mention on his sketch that his southern route most likely taken by the VC-10s could well have been further south and its approach more from the SSE than the ESE. I tend to believe that this is the case particularly if the Ludlow and Bromsgrove objects were one and the same, and the route taken by this object was south of Birmingham. Its approach towards Stafford (obviously avoiding so far as possible major population centres) would have been SSE than the ESE as shown on the sketch.
- 6.8 The conclusion to these sightings are classified as KNOWN (POSITIVE IFO): Refuelling exercise using two VC-10s from RAF Brize Norton.

LESS than one person in ten is unemployed in the West Midlands as the jobless total plunged during April.

In the West Midlands more than 6,000 came off the dole leaving 255,944 — or 9.9 per cent of the population — without a job.

And the trend was reflected nationally with a total of 2,535,989 now out of work, a fall of around 56,000.

Did mystery lights reveal secret flights of F-19?

TWO mysterious objects seen flying across the Stafford night sky have led to renewed speculation over America's most secret war plane.

The sighting has added to mounting suspicions that the Stealth F-19 radar-proof fighter is being test flown regularly in and around the Midlands and East Anglia.

Both British and American governments deny the existence of the F-19, but the specialist defence magazine, Jane's Weekly, has confirmed that rumours of it are strong.

The odd triangular shapes (pictured) were reported by Eileen Ballard, of Fernwood, Stafford, at around 10pm on Monday. She saw them with friends and immediately

reported them as UFOs.

But the British UFO Research Association says it believes what Mrs Ballard saw were not UFOs, but two of the top secret USAF Stealth fighters.

Despite the official denials, BUFORA say they are flown on secret tests at night from RAF Alconbury near Peterborough, where they say a small squadron is stationed.

Mrs Ballard, a statistical officer with Staffordshire Police, was in the garden of her neighbours, Colin and Anne Paterson with another Fernwood couple, Richard and Gillian Weaver, when she saw the strange objects flying towards them.

"We were standing in the

garden when two spotlights came through the sky towards us so that we couldn't see anything else," said Mrs Ballard.

"They banked over and went into side by side formation, one above the other, and flew slowly across the sky without any noise at all.

"They flew very close together and were triangular in shape, too high for micro light aircraft and too low for normal aircraft. There were a lot of lights underneath, red and green, around the edge and within that lots others."

Director of investigations at BUFORA, Jenny Randles, said yesterday it sounded like the top secret Stealth aircraft.

"We've had quite a spate of these in the Midlands, about a

dozen since December.

"Of course, there is a veil of official secrecy, but we think there may be a small squadron secretly based in Britain at RAF Alconbury."

Mike Daly, assistant editor of Jane's Weekly, said nothing could be said about Stealth for certain, but that flights from Alconbury were rumoured.

"It's all a big secret, but the US is rumoured to have 40 Stealth F-19 fighters and there are reports that the Americans have flown them to East Anglia from California in the back of a Galaxy, reassembled them there and test flown them. "But two together all lit up over a populated area would seem

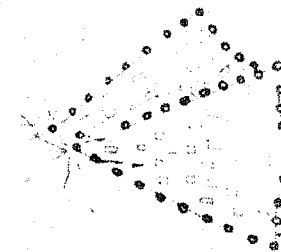
very odd, though I suppose they would need lights if their

would make more sense to fly them over the North Sea."

Lockheed are said to have built the F-19 in a project named Have Blue. They are covered with non-metallic material designed to absorb rather than reflect radar transmissions.

Mrs Ballard said: "I was in the RAF myself for four years and if these were planes, they must have developed something pretty fantastic that defies all the laws of flying."

A spokeswoman at RAF Alconbury denied any knowledge of Stealth F-19s and said that there were certainly none stationed there or any ever flown in at any time.

The Earl's big sale

THE Earl of Lichfield is selling 1,250 acres of his Staffordshire estates to offset the £2million plus cost of land and buildings he bought last Autumn at Ranton from the Waterford-Wedgwood Group.

'I stood under it for 15 minutes'

A REQUEST by Stafford MP Bill Cash for more details on last month's UFOs has brought further reports from witnesses.

Last week, Mr Cash said he would be putting the sightings to Defence Minister Roger Freeman for official investigation.

But this week, The Newsletter received several new reports. The most startling was from Joan and Michael Acocks, of Hillcote Hollow, Stafford.

Mrs Acocks said she and her husband actually saw the object appear and disappear in exactly the same position several times.

"We were just on the way back from a stroll on the Monday night and we saw two triangular shapes hovering above some trees. They were lit up, but somehow they didn't seem solid objects.

"I stood there looking and all of a sudden it just disappeared. I stood there for a while and then it appeared again exactly as before in the

same place, hovering for a few seconds before it disappeared again and we walked on."

Mrs Acocks said she and her husband, who is an accountant, saw the UFO at the same time as previous reports, 9.50pm on Monday, May 16.

"What struck me more than anything was that it was absolutely silent," added Mrs Acocks.

"It was going very slowly and seemed in no rush to go

from end to end, completely motionless and completely silent.

"There were a lot of lights around it. I got out of the car and stood for about 15 minutes, hoping it was going to land, but it just drifted off.

"It definitely wasn't a plane, there was no sound at all."

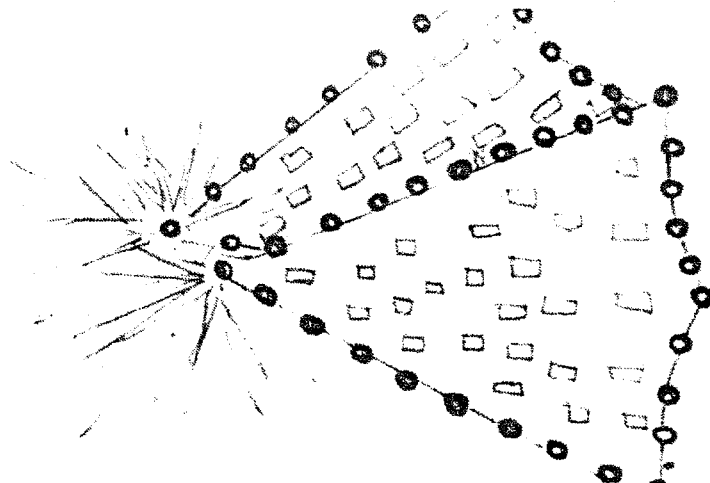

Director of investigations at BUFORA, Jenny Randalls, said: "It's often very difficult to make factual observations at night. If it has a lot of lights and suddenly they're put out, it's easy for the observer to assume it's disappeared.

"Hovering can be an illusion because it's difficult to judge distance and the complete silence can be caused if the engines are highly tuned and the wind's blowing away from you.

"I'm as certain as I can be that there's a conventional explanation to this one, probably the F-19 or remotely controlled reconnaissance aircraft known as RPVs which are all sorts of shapes and sizes and are also an open secret. They can hover and they're fairly quiet and they're used a lot in Northern Ireland."

Mr Cash reiterated his request for all information on the subject from witnesses to be sent directly to him so that it could be put to the minister.

Another witness, Elaine Willacy, of Harrowby Street, Littleworth, said she had a look at the object through binoculars with two neighbours.

"It came across the sky, looking just like the sketch in the paper," said Mrs Willacy, "then it seemed to turn quickly and as it came over, it was just an array of bright lights, orange, red and blue.

"We had a look through binoculars but we couldn't

anywhere. It felt as though someone was looking down on us and taking pictures."

David Myatt from Marston House Farm, Church Eaton phoned in and said he'd seen exactly the same things seven years ago.

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Lights puzzler theory

I WAS interested to read your news story last week concerning the lights seen in the sky over Stafford on May 16 at approximately 9.30pm. I was travelling from Abbots Bromley to Rugeley at that time and first saw two lights moving slowly westwards over Cannock Chase. They then turned through 180 degrees over Stafford and headed east passing directly overhead just north of Rugeley.

Like your correspondent, I was puzzled by this unusual sight as whatever it was it appeared to be moving very slowly and without making any audible sound. However, as the lights passed overhead and with the aid of binoculars, I was able to make out the shape of two identical aircraft and at the same time the sound of jet engines could be heard.

I am of the opinion that what intrigued us all were two RAF VC-10 tanker aircraft carrying out a night in-flight refuelling exercise. To successfully execute this difficult task, they would need all the lighting available to them and to be flying at comparatively low speed whilst remaining on station in relation to one another.

101 Squadron at RAF Brize Norton in Oxfordshire operates these aircraft and an enquiry to them would no doubt confirm whether or not my explanation is correct.

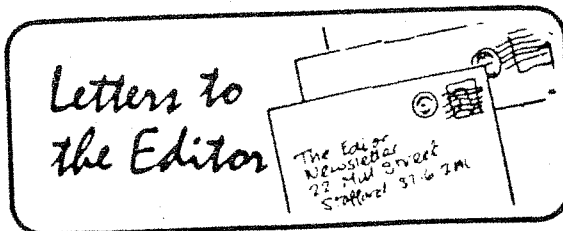
After several minutes in view, the object vanished in the south-west to reappear silently in the sky to the north-east, only a matter of seconds later.

In defence of 'culprits'

I WRITE with reference to B Treadwell's letter of May 20 and trust that 'The Culprits' may be given a little empathy and understanding with the facts that I set out, but would point out I do not write on behalf of the owners of Rowley Park, but as a resident who has spent all his life in the Park and whose life has been the Park and it's peoples'.

Rowley Park was established as a private residential estate in 1871, it is governed by Covenant by which all owners abide. The estate is maintained by means of a rate levied on all owner-occupiers, this rate is exclusive of the council rate. The private rates thus levied are to maintain roads and footpaths and for the general management of the estate including the residents' communal Pleasure Gardens situated between Lawn and Crescent Road.

The Borough Council do not undertake any maintenance within the estate and road sweeping for example, if requested, would be the subject of a charge.

The passing years have cast many shadows over the once tranquil, peaceful and secluded Rowley Park Estate - many of the larger houses being converted into flats, welfare homes and even a hospital, thus increasing the heavy volume of traffic. We accept this as all are contributors to the Rowley Park private rates. The Blessed William Howard School built in Rowley Avenue in the '60s has added a little to our discomfort, however the pupils living in the south of the town who use the Rowley Park private roads to make their way to and from school are generally very well behaved and in passing through the Park bring colour and youthful high spirits to the scene.

The Rowley Park residents' main concern is the public's use of the stadium footpath as a through-road to Highfields Council Estate. When the Borough Council acquired the land which is now Rowley Park Stadium they acquired with it the pedestrian access and exit right of way at points in Mary Rand Close and the rear lane of Lawn Road - hitherto these entrances/exits had been used for the movement of cattle when the land was used for grazing purposes.

It was never intended that the access and exit entrances in Rowley Park should be used other than by pedestrians who wished to participate in the sport's facilities provided, and for general recreational purposes, certainly not as a public highway and through road to Highfields Estate. Indeed the Borough Council have a Bye-Law prohibiting cycling or vehicular traffic within the Stadium confines.

The erection of a barrier adjacent to the access/exit point at the rear lane of Lawn Road into the

Stadium is justified because of the danger hither-to of both cyclists and motor-cycles who used this entrance to and from the stadium illegally to the danger of Rowley Park residents - especially children. Now at least they have to dismount which is a small comfort - but cyclists are able to negotiate this barrier.

At the present time it is estimated that between 400 and 500 use this entrance to the stadium daily not for recreational purposes only but as means of a short cut to Highfields Estate, and we are even more concerned now as the Borough Council no longer close any entrances to the Stadium at nightfall.

No, the people of The Park do not consider themselves a 'People Set Apart' we are as one with the friendly and kindly residents and near neighbours of Highfields Estate, but we have every right to preserve the rights we hold governing the running and care of our very beautiful Park, and we are concerned with the greatly increased number of cyclists and motorcyclists taking a short cut through the Stadium.

Strange lights riddle still hovers over town

UFOs 'TOO LOW, SLOW, QUIET AND BRIGHT' TO BE VC-10s, CLAIM EYE-WITNESSES

MYSTERY still shrouds last week's UFO sighting over Stafford.

Two strange, triangular objects with a lot of lights were reported by Eileen Ballard near her Fernwood home on Monday night.

But this week, response from other readers who also saw them and Mrs Ballard's sketches in the Newsletter still disagree on what they were.

John Teasdale, of Knowle Road Stafford said he thought—the

mystery aircraft were no more than VC-10s flying from RAF Brize Norton in Oxfordshire.

And a phone call to Brize Norton revealed that two VC-10s did take off from the station at 8.35pm that night, and a spokeswoman said it was possible that they might have flown over Staffordshire.

were VC-10s, no way.

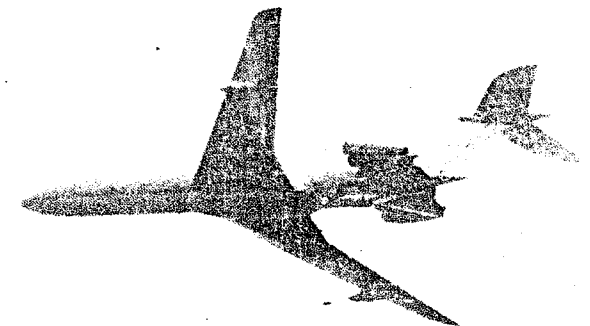
"They were too low, slow and quiet and the lights were too bright for VC-10s. It might have been a glider, but I would have heard the wind and I heard nothing. VC-10s

UFO witness plea

STAFFORD MP Bill Cash has asked the Ministry of Defence to look into UFOs seen over the town last month.

He is appealing for any witnesses to come forward so that information can be passed on to the minister, Roger Freeman.

This week, Mr Cash said: "I have written to Mr Freeman and given him details of the sightings and I have asked him to make inquiries and let me know his views.

"Several independent individuals in the constituency who can be regarded as reliable witnesses saw these things and were caused a great deal of concern. I don't know what they were myself."

The mysterious objects were seen over Stafford on Monday, May 16 at around 10pm by police statistical officer Eileen Ballard and five of her friends from their home on Fernwood, Stafford.

She reported large triangular shapes with a lot of lights cruising slowly and, most

remarkably, with complete silence overhead.

A story in the Newsletter and a sketch by Mrs Ballard sparked off other reports by witnesses. John Teasdale of Knowle Road, Stafford said he was sure they were refuelling VC-10s, but another reader, Enid Turner, of George Close, Uttoxeter, disagreed flatly.

An aviation enthusiast, Mrs Turner said the objects didn't even make enough noise for a glider, let alone a VC-10. Several other people in Uttoxeter, said Mrs Turner, also saw the UFOs and reports also came in from Penkridge and Wolverhampton.

The British UFO Research Association said it suspected the UFOs were in fact the top secret American Stealth F-19 radar proof fighters on test flight from RAF Alconbury in Norfolk.

The existence of the F-19 is officially denied by both British and American governments.

AFTER MP'S PLEA, MORE TELL OF UFO MYSTERY

'I stood under it for 15 minutes'

A REQUEST by Stafford MP Bill Cash for more details on last month's UFOs has brought further reports from witnesses.

Last week, Mr Cash said he would be putting the strange sightings to Defence Minister Roger Freeman for official investigation.

But this week, The Newsletter received several new reports. The most startling was from Joan and Michael Acocks, of Hillcote Hollow, Stafford.

Mrs Acocks said she and her husband actually saw the object appear and disappear in exactly the same position several times.

"We were just on the way back from a stroll on the Monday night and we saw two triangular shapes hovering above some trees. They were lit up, but somehow they didn't seem solid objects.

"I stood there looking and all of a sudden it just disappeared. I stood there for a while and then it appeared again exactly as before in the

same place, hovering for a few seconds before it disappeared again and we walked on."

Mrs Acocks said she and her husband, who is an accountant, saw the UFO at the same time as previous reports, 9.50pm on Monday, May 16.

"What struck me more than anything was that it was absolutely silent," added Mrs Acocks.

Another witness, Elaine Willacy, of Harrowby Street, Littleworth, said she had a look at the object through binoculars with two neighbours.

"It came across the sky, looking just like the sketch in the paper," said Mrs Willacy, "then it seemed to turn quickly and as it came over, it was just an array of bright lights, orange, red and blue.

"We had a look through binoculars but we couldn't

anywhere. It felt as though someone was looking down on us and taking pictures."

David Myatt from Marston House Farm, Church Eaton phoned in and said he'd seen exactly the same things seven years ago.

"There were reports about it at the time," said Mr Myatt, "I saw it just outside Brocton on my way to Stafford. I looked up and saw it and stopped and it was right over head, about 50 feet

from end to end, completely motionless and completely silent.

"There were a lot of lights around it. I got out of the car and stood for about 15 minutes, hoping it was going to land, but it just drifted off.

"It definitely wasn't a plane, there was no sound at all."

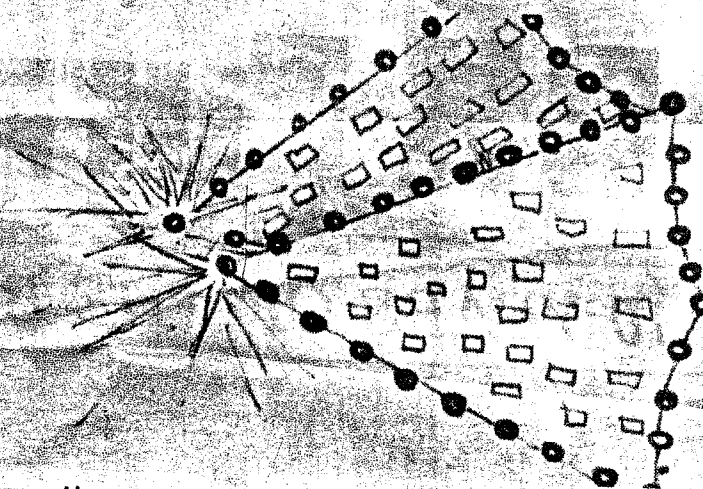
But the British UFO Research Association still maintain the mystery objects are the American top secret radar proof F-19 Stealth fighter.

Director of investigations at BUFORA, Jenny Randalls, said: "It's often very difficult to make factual observations at night. If it has a lot of lights and suddenly they're put out, it's easy for the observer to assume it's disappeared.

"Hovering can be an illusion because it's difficult to judge distance and the complete silence can be caused if the engines are highly tuned and the wind's blowing away from you.

"I'm as certain as I can be that there's a conventional explanation to this one, probably the F-19 or remotely controlled reconnaissance aircraft known as RPVs which are all sorts of shapes and sizes and are also an open secret. They can hover and they're fairly quiet and they're used a lot in Northern Ireland."

Mr Cash reiterated his request for all information on the subject from witnesses to be sent directly to him so that it could be put to the minister.

Perhaps you were not aware of their official links with 'Flying Saucer Review' - and its ludicrous allegations about AIDS from outer space, genies and UFOs and plots to steal library books on the subject! I trust this revelation effects your judgement of these 'scientists' somewhat.

We have been studying the circles since they first appeared in 1980 and can provide documented evidence that demonstrates just how much of what Andrews and Delgado are claiming is highly suspect. These circles appear throughout Britain, have done so for many years, and are no threat to anybody. They have perfectly adequate explanations in terms of conventional science. The current hype and suggestions that cereal production be halted are just scaremongering and highly irresponsible. The idea that we should waste taxpayers money on something already largely resolved when there are so many other sources that DO need money is little short of a scandal.

If you have any qualms about your support for these people please contact us and we will be delighted to help by supplying reassuring documentation. We do not wish to see your fine judgement tarnished by association with this space-age fantasy.

Teenagers see flying saucers

TWO TEENAGERS believe they may have witnessed the landing of a flying saucer in a field outside Margate.

Wilfred Gomez, and Simon Millington were driving along deserted Nash Road one at night when they saw a "spiralling vortex of flashing light" descend and then disappear.

Mr Gomez, 19, a student from Whitnash Green, Kingsgate, said: "We were about a third of a mile away when we saw what looked like an upturned satellite TV dish, with lots of flashing lights.

"It was making a noise which I cannot really describe.

"It appeared to brush the ground - then the

lights blinked out.

"It was absolutely unbelievable.

"Simon and I were returning from work, we hadn't been drinking and both of us were wide awake listening to the stereo."

When they went to investigate, the teenagers discovered a 60ft circle of flattened corn in the middle of the field, with a smaller circle nearby.

The shocked pair left hurriedly - but Mr Gomez returned in daylight with an Adscene news team.

The perfectly-formed circles were still there, the undamaged corn stalks swirled in an anti-clockwise direction.

Mr Gomez said: "The circles provide concrete proof something was there."

The circles have been reported all across south-west England, but these are the first sightings in Kent. The circles are usually formed at night and until now no eyewitness accounts of their formation exist.

They have been linked to UFO sightings, but other explanations for their formation include spiral winds, freak weather, running rabbits and even rutting deer.

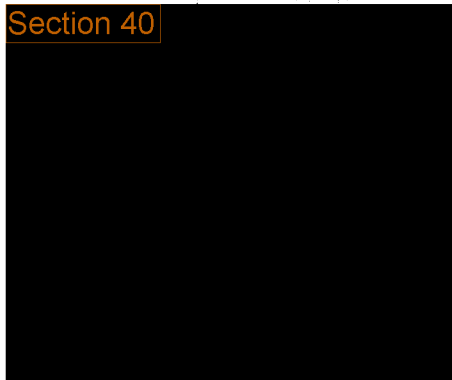
Adscene contacted the radar operators at nearby RAF Manston to see if they had noticed anything unusual.

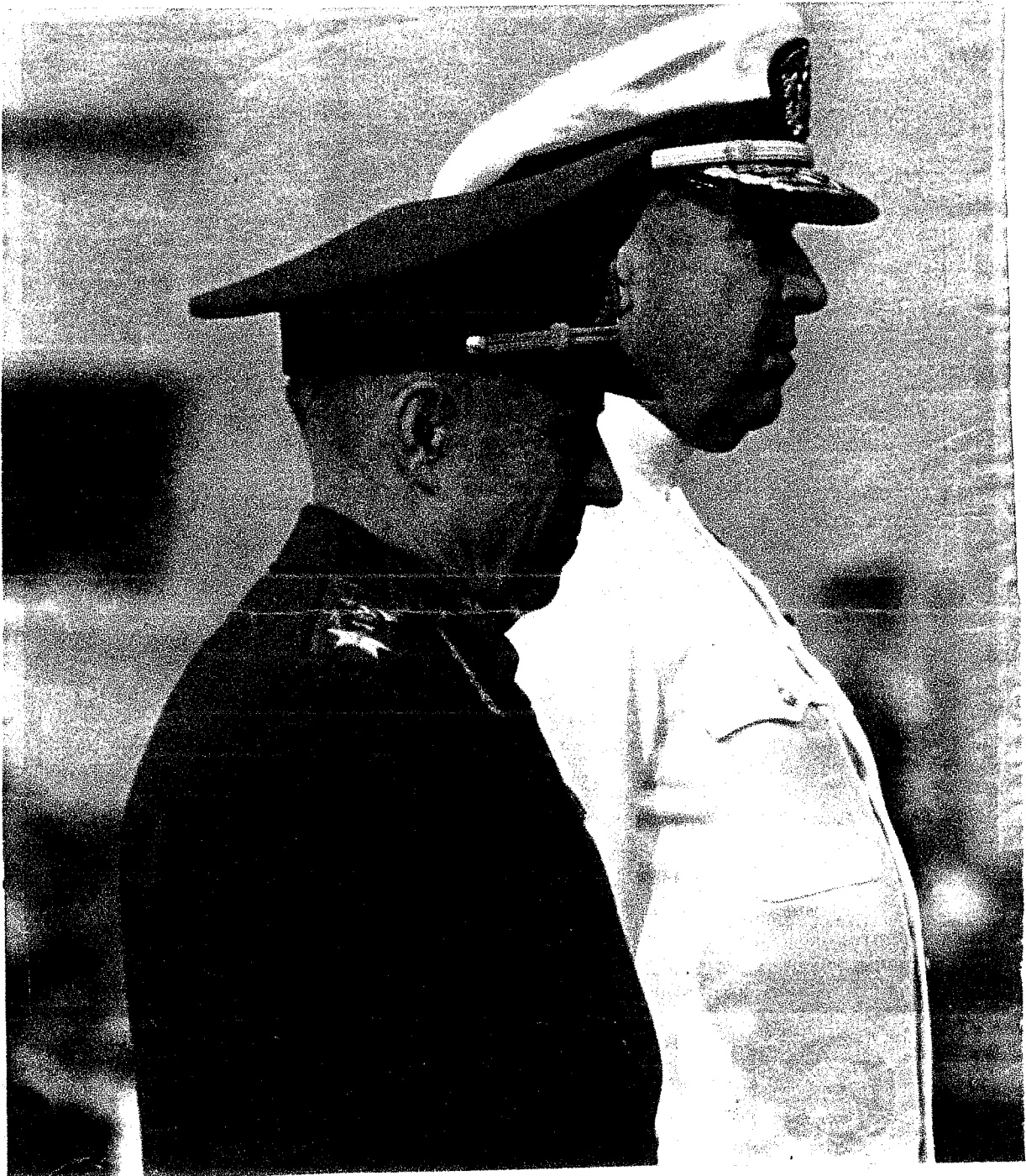

Reagan reaps arms-control harvest

President Reagan is great at chitchat. At lunch with Eduard Shevardnadze, the Soviet foreign minister, he broke the ice by saying, "I am a farmer" or "I come from farm country," depending on which aide's account you believe. In either case, Reagan was suggesting a degree of agricultural expertise he doesn't have.

Frank Carlucci, the president's national security adviser, practically spilled his bowl of soup. Reagan followed it up with a query: Tell me about Soviet agricultural reforms. Shevardnadze was more than willing to hold forth. And so it went — 90 minutes of mostly happy talk in the State Dining Room.

It was an odd prelude to one of the most important achievements of Reagan's presidency, an agreement "in principle" with the Soviets to eliminate intermediate-range nuclear missiles.

Three days after the lunch, Reagan announced to reporters that his "zero option" had succeeded. "I am pleased to note that agreement in principle was reached to conclude the INF treaty," he said. He used slightly bolder language in a speech to the U.N. General Assembly, calling it "a truly historic treaty that will eliminate an entire class of U.S. and Soviet nuclear weapons."

Reagan has grounds to crow. His brand of arms control has been vindicated. He built up, rather than offering new concessions, to prod the Soviets to agree to remove their 441 SS-20 missiles, aimed mostly at Western Europe.

Now they've agreed. But Reagan had to be extraordinarily patient

and thick-skinned to get to this point. He had to rebuff faint hearts in his own State Department who wanted to settle for less than total elimination of intermediate-range missiles. Reagan, backed by Defense Secretary Caspar Weinberger and his assistant Richard Perle, held to the zero option. Patience paid off.

The Soviets initially called the zero option totally unacceptable. When the first Pershing IIs were deployed in 1983, they stormed out of arms control talks in Geneva. Reagan took heat from Democrats for that, and he took more when he turned down a string of Soviet counteroffers.

That the Soviets will back down if you're patient is but one of the conclusions to be drawn from Reagan's INF success. President Carter dropped his strategic arms proposal in 1977, six weeks after the Soviets initially turned it down. Reagan stuck to the zero option for six years.

Another conclusion is that you can't know if a proposal dubbed unacceptable or non-negotiable actually is until you propose it.

One final conclusion: You may have to build up to build down. Had Reagan not deployed the Pershing IIs and ground-launched cruise missiles, the Soviets wouldn't have agreed to give up their SS-20s.

The downside to the INF treaty — the Soviet advantage in conventional forces in Europe — isn't taken seriously at the White House. Richard Nixon and Henry Kissinger declared last spring that with the Pershing IIs gone, the Soviets will be free to wage con-

ventional war.

Not quite. The United States still will have some 4,000 nuclear weapons based in Europe. To the extent that Europeans become anxious about the troop and tank imbalance, that's good, argues Perle. Maybe this way the Europeans will be prompted to do something, instead of merely whining.

Shevardnadze was in an unusually amiable mood for the talks in Washington. He told jokes at lunch with Reagan, laughing uproariously at his own humor, even though the Americans, including Reagan, didn't catch on.

At the White House, Shevardnadze delivered a friendly letter to Reagan from Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev, who has an ulterior motive. Perle says Gorbachev has gone along with the INF treaty to clear the way for a strategic agreement that stymies SDI.

Shevardnadze brought a new proposal with him that offered a choice between two ways of limiting SDI field testing. Either one would put a crimp in development of SDI, so Weinberger is strongly opposed.

For now, Reagan sounds resolute. When a group of conservative activists met with him recently, he vowed, "I'm not going to sell out SDI. I'm not going to trade it for anything."

But when James Hackett of the Heritage Foundation said conservatives want a deployment program, not a research program, to rally around, Reagan balked. He wouldn't commit to near-term deployment, and the conservatives came away less than satisfied.

Reagan keeps them guessing

about his attitude toward the Soviets, too. Is he too eager to reach arms agreements? A fresh stream of anti-Soviet talk by Reagan suggests not.

While Shevardnadze was in Washington, Reagan, in a speech, said he's "a collector of stories that citizens of the Soviet Union tell among themselves ... and just yesterday I added a new one to the collection." Seems a cab driver told a visitor that a building was the tallest in Moscow. Huh? the visitor exclaimed. That building is only two stories tall. Yes, the cabbie responded, but you can see all the way to Siberia from it. It's KGB headquarters.

On Sept. 25, he told another joke. How do you tell who's a communist? It's someone who reads Marx and Lenin. How do you tell who's an anti-communist? It's someone who understands Marx and Lenin.

That's Reagan's hard-nosed side. The other side is more ethereal. He muses about taking Gorbachev on a helicopter trip over shopping centers and backyard swimming pools, and telling the Soviet leader that these are what working people have in the United States.

Near the end of his lunch with Shevardnadze, Reagan wondered aloud what would happen if the world faced an "alien threat" from outer space. MR. FRIEDMAN: Thank you, Mr. President. Mr. President, we all thank you for your remarks and now we come to the moment where we have a question and answer session.

MR. FRIEDMAN: What do you consider to be the most important need in international relations?

THE PRESIDENT: Oh, my goodness. (Laughter.) I would -- that is quite a question, and how to get at it? I think the need is -- well, just actual frankness and a desire for a peaceful solution. I think maybe I'd answer it this way: I keep -- in my frustration sometimes -- you know, actually, if you count some of the things going on in smaller countries and all, there have been about 114 wars since World War II. But I've often wondered what if all of us in the world discovered that we were threatened by an outer -- a power from outer space -- from another planet. Wouldn't we all of a sudden find that we didn't have any differences between us at all, we were all human beings, citizens of the world, and wouldn't we come together to fight that particular threat. Well, in a way we have something of that kind today -- mentioning nuclear power again. We now have a weapon that can destroy the world and why don't we recognize that threat more clearly and then come together with one aim in mind -- how safely, sanely and quickly can we rid the world of this threat to our civilization and our existence. (Applause.)

The advent of nuclear weapons was just another tragic reminder of the fundamental nature of that change. A material symbol and expression of absolute military power, nuclear weapons at the same time revealed the absolute limits of that power.

The problem of mankind's survival and self-preservation came to the fore.

We are witnessing most profound social change.

Whether in the East or the South, the West or the North, hundreds of millions of people, new nations and States, new public movements and ideologies have moved to the forefront of history.

Broad-based and frequently turbulent popular movements have given expression, in a multidimensional and contradictory way, to a longing for independence, democracy and social justice. The idea of democratizing the entire world order has become a powerful socio-political force.

At the same time, the scientific and technological revolution has turned many economic, food, energy, environmental, information and population problems, which only recently we treated as national or regional ones, into global problems.

Thanks to the advances in mass media and means of transportation, the world seems to have become more visible and tangible. International communication has become easier than ever before.

Today, the preservation of any kind of "closed" societies is hardly possible. This calls for a radical review of approaches to the totality of the problems of international cooperation as a major element of universal security.

The world economy is becoming a single organism, and no State, whatever its social system or economic status, can normally develop outside it.

Having investigated this ufo report without succeeding in attributing its stimulus to any mundane causes, I am writing to you in order that, by referring to your records of possible contemporaneous reports, you might be able to shed some light on the nature of the object allegedly observed.

I trust therefore, by enclosing this transcript of my investigations, the data therein will aid you in possibly identifying the object seen as an aircraft or helicopter which happened to be in the given area at the time.

Of course, I do realise that your jurisdiction vis-a-vis the ufo controversy is strictly confined within the parameters of defence and this situation is taken as read. In fact, contrary to the popular belief, evidence is now beginning to emerge that the UFO question has little, if anything at all, to do with threats to the airspace of the U.K.: indeed we seem to be dealing with something archaic rather than technological! I have been given your name and address by the Dept. of Transport as someone interested in a possible UFO sighting. The circumstances were as follows:-

I was driving along the A13 near Rainham in Essex at 10.30 am on Wed. 12th July last. It was a bright, clear, sunny morning and I was heading west, towards London, travelling on my own.

I suddenly noticed what appeared to be lights in the sky - flashing to my left - which I immediately took to be a helicopter approaching on a parallel course to the road. As the object, quickly, came nearer to me I could see that it was not what I had at first thought it to be. As it passed me, I could see it was a perfect cone shape - travelling pointed end forward - made of a shiny metallic material. The 'lights' were in fact the sun glinting on it as it spun round.

I happened to be close to a lay-by and I immediately halted, jumped out of the car and looked back to where I had seen it - but could see nothing at all. No one else appeared to have noticed.

I phoned the police and the London City Airport, also the Dept. of Transport, but no one has been able to give me any explanation.

I should be interested in any comments you may have and would like to know if this type of object is a common sighting.

The size and height were difficult to estimate. I can only say it was a similar height and size and speed of a fairly low flying helicopter - but this object had no rotor, no wings and was as I have described.

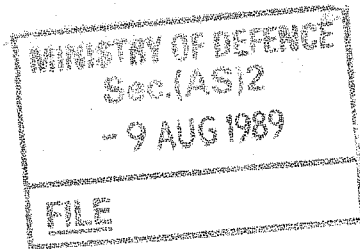

Although at the time of the reported incident the A13 trunk road is very busy, being as it is the main road from London to Chelmsford, none of the other drivers present on that road at the time, as far as is known, reported anything unusual to the authorities.

CONCLUSIONS:-

The nature of this phenomenon is indeterminate so far and it is left to such authorities as the MOD to provide details of any potential, contemporaneous sightings in the given area.

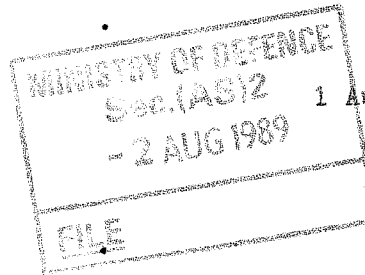

Dear Mrs Thatcher

I'm writing to you on the subject of UFOs', and about reported sightings and landings made by various people from all trades and walks of life.

All these people which have reported UFO sightings and landings over the past 30 to 40 years cannot be branded as all cranks by any Government officialdom. Because the people which have reported these sightings and landings are all broad minded, and intelligent people who are not given to having hallucinations. My list of UFO sightings start from the 19th September 1952, when two RAF officers, and three aircrew at RAF Topcliffe observed a UFO apparently following a Meteor jet as it was coming into land at RAF Dishforth, Yorkshire, five miles away. The sighting took place at 10:53AM.

On 3rd November 1953 at 10:00AM, Royal Air force Flying officer [Section 40] and his navigator Flying officer [Section 40] were flying a two-seater Vampire jet light fighter on a sector reconnaissance at 20,000 feet near their base at RAF West Malling in Kent, when they saw a UFO stationary ahead of them, it appeared star shape in appearance.

In February 1954, a young lad called [Section 40] together with a cousin of his called [Section 40] took two photographs of a flying saucer near Coniston, Lancashire.

On the 23rd February 1955, a man called [Section 40] who was employed as a bricklayer at Broadlands, was cycling on his way to work when he noticed a UFO landing in between Romsey lodge and Middlesbridge lodge. Frederic Briggs then noticed an Alien wearing a dark blue overalls and a helmet exiting from the UFO.

An impressive UFO sighting by RAF and the US Air force personnel took place on the night of 13/14th August 1956, when at least one UFO was simultaneously tracked by three different ground based radars at RAF/USAF Bentwaters and Wakenheath, Suffolk. And RAF Neatishead Norfolk.

On the 21st October 1957, Flying officer [Section 40] Flying a Meteor jet whilst on a training exercise from RAF North Luffenham, nearly collided with an UFO over RAF Gaydon, Warwickshire.

The incident occurred at 9:18PM at an altitude of 28,000 feet.

A UFO appeared over the South East of London on the 15th December 1980, there was about six different witnesses to this particular UFO sighting.

And last of all but not the least another UFO sighting was reported at RAF/JSAP Woodbridge, near Ipswich, Suffolk.

This sighting happened on the 27th December 1980, in Rendlesham Forest.

The witnesses to this particular sighting were a Colonel Halt, Sergeant [Section 40], and Larry Warren.

According to certain Government figures at least 90% of UFO sightings can be explained in the terms of weather balloons, aeroplanes, and satellites, and lightning.

But there is still 10% of UFO sightings and landings that the Government will not or cannot explain.

There is a number of questions that I would like to ask my honourable Prime Minister, which I trust will be answered.

Do UFOs' prove a threat to British airspace?

Why is your Government remaining silent on the subject of UFOs'?

Why are UFOs' steeped in secrecy by your Government, and why doesn't the Government release such sightings and landings to the public, whom I feel have a
