

Donald Trump Reportedly Considering Renaming McDonald's to "McTrump"



Washington — Former U.S. President Donald Trump is reportedly considering the possibility of renaming the global fast-food chain McDonald's to "McTrump," according to several sources close to his inner circle. Although no official announcement has been made so far, the idea is already generating strong reactions across political, economic, and media spheres.

According to these sources, Trump views the move as a strategic opportunity blending personal branding, marketing, and economic patriotism. Known for his fondness for the company's products and his longstanding habit of placing his name on buildings and brands, the former president reportedly sees this change as a natural extension of his political and commercial identity.

Analysts also warn that such a rebranding could further polarize public opinion, as Donald Trump remains a deeply divisive figure both in the United States and internationally. Communication experts additionally highlight the risk of brand dilution, noting that McDonald’s global recognition is largely rooted in its political neutrality.

In the absence of official confirmation, this information should be treated with caution. Nevertheless, it once again illustrates Donald Trump’s ability to dominate media attention and spark debate, even outside formal political arenas.
